Subject: Approve an ordinance authorizing negotiation and execution of a cost participation agreement, Service Extension Request No. 2523, with CENTEX HOMES, INC, providing terms and conditions for construction of 12-inch water main and appurtenances to provide water service to the Ridgeview Subdivision located along U.S. Highway 290 West, east of South View Road with City cost reimbursement in an amount not to exceed 33% of the actual construction costs ("hard costs") or \$165,082, whichever is less, and approve an Ordinance waiving the requirements of Section 25-9-62 of the City Code relating to amount of cost participation

The Ridgeview Subdivision is a proposed single-family development located on approximately 93.1 acres of land located along U.S. Highway 290 West east of South View Road (the "Property"), outside the full-purpose city limits. Centex Homes, Inc., (the "Developer") has submitted Service Extension Request 2523 requesting that the City provide water utility service to the Property which is within the Council approved Impact Fee Boundary, Utility Service Area, City of Austin Water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) area and also within the Drinking Water Protection Zone and Slaughter Creek Watershed

The request to approve SER 2523 is being brought to the City Council because of Section 25-9-34 of the Code Code that requires City Council approval for all Service Extension Requests in the Drinking Water Protection Zone and in an area annexed for limited purposes or in the extraterritorial jurisdiction.

Under the proposed cost participation agreement, the Developer would construct approximately 3,000 feet of 12-inch water main that will provide for a future "loop" through the Property from the existing 12-inch water main in South View Road at the proposed northern entrance to the subdivision, east through the Property to the northeast property corner at the proposed right-of-way of U.S. Highway 290 West. The proposed 12-inch water main improvements will eventually provide a second water main to serve the existing development within this area. Based on the Utility's capacity analysis, adequate system capacity exists to meet the projected demands of the property to be served

The City will reimburse the Developer for the hard costs of the 12-inch water main and appurtenances

constructed within public right-of-way or easements for a total not to exceed 33% of the actual construction costs ("hard costs") of the 12-inch water main up to a maximum of \$165,082.00, whichever is less. The City would be reimbursing the Developer for the 4-inch increase in pipe diameter that brings the pipe diameter to a total of 12-inches. The 4-inches are 33% of the 12-inch pipe. The Developer will bear all other costs for engineering, design, financing, interest, fiscal security, accounting, insurance, inspections, permitting, project management, easement acquisition and legal services associated with this construction.

Because the City requested that the Developer construct water improvements beyond those needed only to serve the proposed development and the current City Code, which is in the process of revision does not provide adequate City cost participation, the Developer is requesting a waiver from City Ordinance requirements in Section 25-9-62 relating to the amount of cost participation. Under this Section, the amount of cost participation for over-sizing the main is computed by multiplying \$3.00 by each inch in diameter that the water main is oversized (8-inch water main to a 12-inch main), by the actual length of water main constructed within public right-of-ways or easements which would result in a reimbursement amount not to exceed \$36,000 00


State law adopted in 2005 requires that infrastructure costs required by a political subdivision for a development be "roughly proportionate" to the cost of the infrastructure for the development. The proposed proportional share method reflects the intent of this state law.

This action waives the requirements of Section 25-9-62, thereby allowing the reimbursement of 33% of the hard costs of the 12-inch water main up to a maximum of \$165,082.00

The Developer will conform to the City of Austin design criteria and construction standards in all respects. The applicant will construct all required improvements at their cost and after approval of construction, the applicant will dedicate the facilities to the City for ownership, operation and maintenance

The Developer agrees to allow the City to use the Plans and Specifications approved by the Director, to solicit and publish invitations for bids for the construction of the improvements following standard City bidding practices and procedures, including the minority-owned business enterprise procurement program found in Chapter 2-9, City Code, as amended, and Chapters 212 and 252, Texas Local Government Code, as amended

The Watershed Protection and Development Review Department, Transportation, Planning and Sustainability Department and other applicable City Departments have reviewed the subject Service Extension Request. The staff of Watershed Department presented information regarding this SER to the Environmental Board on January 24, 2007 and they found it to be SOS compliant.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE A COST PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT WITH CENTEX HOMES, INC. FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A 12-INCH WATER MAIN AND APPURTENANCES TO PROVIDE WATER SERVICE TO THE RIDGEVIEW SUBDIVISION; AND WAIVING REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 25-9-62 OF THE CITY CODE RELATING TO AMOUNT OF COST PARTICIPATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

PART 1. This ordinance applies to an application for cost reimbursement under City Code Chapter 25-9, Article 1, Division 2, Subpart B. (Cost Reimbursement And Cost Participation) by Centex Homes, Inc. for construction of a 12-inch water main and appurtenances to provide water service to the Ridgeview Subdivision located along US. Highway 290 West, east of South View Road.

PART 2. The council authorizes the City Manager to negotiate and execute a cost reimbursement agreement with Centex Homes, Inc. allowing reimbursement of 33% of the actual construction costs of the 12-inch water main up to a maximum amount of \$165,082.

PART 3. The council waives the provisions of Section 25-9-62 (Amount of Cost Participation) of the City Code prescribing the maximum amount of City cost participation in an oversized water line.

This ordinance takes effect on 2. 2007.
