The Robert Wood Johnson Common Ground. Transforming Public Health Information Systems Grant is intended to support state and local public health agencies collaboration in two areas: (1) to prepare agencies to analyze and redesign their business practices; and (2) to develop collaborative requirement definitions for information systems to strengthen public health agencies that will help to improve preparedness and chronic disease prevention and control

Key personnel, including a representative from the Indigent Care Collaboration, will acquire skills regarding informatics systems by attending a training seminar sponsored by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJ). Informatics studies the structure, behavior, and interactions of natural and artificial systems that store, process and communicate information. It also develops its own conceptual and theoretical foundations. Because computers, individuals and organizations all process information, informatics has computational, cognitive and social aspects.

Skills acquired at the training seminar will first be applied to the Health and Human Services Department (HHSD) Disease Surveillance program. HHSD staff will apply learned business process analysis principles to current practices. In the Disease Surveillance program, skills will be used to analyze disease reporting processes in order to improve accuracy, timeliness and efficiency of reporting and case investigation. Results expected include increased response time efficiency and increased reduction and control of disease transmission to protect and improve the health of our community.

Once implemented and evaluated in this program, key personnel will disseminate information and provide training to identified HHSD departmental staff for utilization of the informatics systems and will assist in applying new business practices to additional intradepartmental units as necessary.
