Subject Authorize acceptance of grant funds from the Lead Hazard Reduction Demonstration Program of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development in the amount of \$3,761,662 00, and amend the Fiscal Year 2006-2007 Operating Budget of the Neighborhood Housing and Community Development Special Revenue Fund of Ordinance No 20060911-001 to appropriate \$3,761,662 00 for the City's LeadSMART Program to be used to provide lead testing and lead hazard control services

Amount and Source of Funding Funding in the amount of \$3,761,662 is available from the U S Department of Housing and Urban Development Office of Healthy Home and Lead Hazard Control Funding in the amount of \$940,464 is provided as a local match using CDBG funds and in-kind services

On January 5, 2007, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced that the City of Austin was one of only twelve communities that would receive a grant award from the Lead Hazard Demonstration Program Using a nation-wide competitive process, HUD awarded more than \$31,000,000 in grants to state and local communities. Austin was one of only two communities in Texas to receive a grant award. At nearly 12% of the HUD allocation, Austin will receive the fourth largest grant award.

With these funds, the City will re-activate its LeadSMART Program that began when HUD awarded \$1,851,741 to the City for its first lead hazard control program. A total of 114 houses occupied by low income households received services between February 1, 2003, and December 31, 2005.

This new grant award will benefit children under the age of six that have tested positive for lead poisoning Over the next three years approximately, 296 houses occupied by low income households will be rehabilitated to eliminate dangerous lead and other hazards. This funding will also stimulate private sector investment in lead hazard control and educate the public about the dangers of lead-based paint.

The program requires a staff of 6 4 full-time equivalent (FTE) positions. There are 1 4 existing FTEs available to the program. Therefore, this action also approves the creation of five FTEs.
