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I ORGANIZATION

A Transportation Policy Board will furnish policy guidance and direction for the continuing transportation study. Membership on the Transportation Policy Board will consist of

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- Four members from the Austin City Council
- 2 One member from the Round Rock City Council
- Three elected officials from the small cities within the CAMPO area to be selected by the respective Commissioners Court of Travis, Williamson and Hays Counties, to include an elected official from a small city in each of the three counties selected for a term and in a manner determined by each Commissioners Court
 - 4 Three members of the Travis County Commissioners Court
 - 5 One member of the Williamson County Commissioners Court
- 6 One member of the Hays County Commissioners Court
- One State Senator from a senate district that includes territory in the CAMPO area, selected by the unanimous agreement of all such Senators, and in the absence of agreement, the Senator elected from the senate district that has the largest population residing in the CAMPO area
 - 8 Two State Representatives
 - One State Representative from a district representing Williamson County selected by the majority vote of all State Representatives elected from districts in Williamson County, and
 - b One State Representative from a district representing Travis County-selected by the majority vote of all State Representatives elected from districts in Travis County, and
 - c If the Senator on the Transportation Policy Board is from a district representing Williamson County, both State Representatives who serve on the Transportation Policy Board shall be from Travis County districts, and

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1		d If after three ballots to select a State Representative from either Williamson
2		or Travis County no candidate receives the votes of a majority of the State
3		Representatives from that county, the Chairperson of the Transportation
4		Policy Board will select the State Representative to serve on the committee
5		by random drawing from the names of candidates who received two or more
6		votes in the final ballot, or from the names of all candidates if no candidate
7		received more than one vote
8	9	One representative from the Capital Metropolitan Transportation Authority
9	10	One representative from the Texas Department of Transportation Austin District
10	11	Once a CAMPO member city reaches a population of 50 000 persons or more as
