CAPITAL AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT STATE OF TEXAS 5 6 **COUNTY OF TRAVIS** 7 THIS AGREEMENT made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2007, by and between the State of 8 9 Texas, acting by and through its Executive Director of the Texas Department of Transportation, 10 (hereinafter referred to as the State), the City of Austin (the City), the County of Travis (Travis 11 County), the County of Williamson (Williamson County), the County of Hays (Hays County), and 12 the Capital Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Capital Metro) 13 14 WITNESSETH 15 16 WHEREAS, Section 134, Title 23, United States Code (23 USC 134) requires that a metropolitan 17 planning organization be designated for each urbanized area of more than 50,000 population by 18 agreement among the Governor and units of general purpose local government which together 19 represent at least 75 percent of the affected population (including the central city or cities as defined 20 by the Bureau of the Census) or in accordance with procedures established by applicable State or 21 local law, and, 22 23 WHEREAS, the State, the City, and Travis County on April 6, 1973, did agree to participate in a 24 continuing, comprehensive, cooperative transportation planning process for the Austin metropolitan 25 area as provided in the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1962, and 26 27 WHEREAS, said agreement was amended on September 30, 1976, June 28, 1984, September 5, 1996, and February 3, 2003 to revise the organization and responsibilities for the Capital Area 28 29 Metropolitan Planning Organization, and, 30 31 WHEREAS, it is the further desire of the signatory agencies that the Study organization be revised 32 to provide a one-committee structure composed principally of local elected officials of a 33 unit of general purpose government which have responsibility for project implementation within the 34 study area,
