The Community Care Services Department (CCSD) utilizes a stockless inventory system for its three dental clinics. CCSD is able, by regular ordering, to keep on hand frequently used items, ordering lower utilization items as necessary. This action will allow CCSD to continue contracting for this stockless inventory system.
