Alcoholic Beverage Waiver Request

Applicant Request

The owner of Hong Duc Supermarket, located at 11220 N. Lamar Blvd., requests a waiver from Section 4-9-5 (A) of the Austin City Code for the sale of alcohol within 300 feet of a public school.

Evaluation Criteria

Section 4-9-5(A): City Council may consider the waiver of the 300 foot distance requirement if it is determined that the enforcement in a particular instance:

- Is not in the best interest of the public
- Constitutes waste or inefficient use of land or other resources
- Creates undue hardship on the applicant
- Does not serve its intended purpose
- Is not effective or necessary
- After consideration to the health, safety, and welfare of the public and the equities
 of the situation, council, for any other reason, determines the waiver to be in the
 best interest of the community

Evaluation Criteria (cont'd)

Section 4-9-5(B)


-- Council may consider the written consent to a waiver under this section from each church, public school, public hospital, day-care center, or childcare facility within 300 feet from the applicant's proposed place of business


GIS Mapping Location

Basis for Staff Recommendation

Based upon Subsection A and B of the Code and letters of opposition received from the school district objecting to the waiver request, staff recommends denial of the waiver.

State Process

- The Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) measures distances between entities (i.e. School and Business) from property line to property line
- The State requires written notification be sent to schools within 1000' of the proposed business
- If the school presents no objection & COA approves the waiver, the state will issue the permit
- If there is objection, the case is sent for an administrative hearing
- The objection of AISD will trigger a state hearing, and it is the recommendation of staff that the city uphold the objection of the school district
