## **ORDINANCE NO. 20070809-002**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 6-4 OF THE CITY CODE RELATING TO WATER USE MANAGEMENT.

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

**PART 1.** Section 6-4-3 (*Administrative Guidelines*) of the City Code is amended to read:

## § 6-4-3 ADMINISTRATIVE RULES [GUIDELINES].

- (A) The director shall adopt administrative <u>rules</u> [guidelines] for the implementation of this <u>chapter</u>. [article. The guidelines are effective when approved by the Water and Wastewater Commission and the Resource Management Commission].
- (B) Before the director may adopt or amend a rule, the director shall present the proposed rule to the Water and Wastewater Commission and the Resource Management Commission.
- (C) The rules shall provide for designated outdoor water use days.
- (D) The rules shall be available for inspection at the Austin Water Utility administrative offices during normal business hours.
- **PART 2.** Section 6-4-51 (*Definitions*) of the City Code is amended to read:

## § 6-4-51 DEFINITIONS.

In this article:

- (1) COMMERCIAL FACILITY means a site with five or more dwelling units, or a civic, commercial, or industrial building and the associated landscaping.
- (2) [(1)] DIRECTOR means the director of the Austin Water Utility.
- (3) <u>DESIGNATED</u> OUTDOOR WATER USE DAY means the day <u>prescribed by rule on which</u> [an owner] a <u>person</u> is permitted to <u>irrigate outdoors</u> [water under the city manager's water conservation guidelines].

# (4) [(2)] NEW LANDSCAPE means vegetation:

- (a) installed at the time of the construction of a residential or commercial facility [of a new house, multi-family building, or commercial building];
- (b) installed as part of a governmental entity's capital improvement project; or
- (c) that alters more than one-half of the area of an existing landscape.
- (5) RESIDENTIAL FACILITY means a site with four or fewer dwelling units.

**PART 3.** Section 6-4-61 (*Water Conservation Guidelines*) of the City Code is amended to read:

#### § 6-4-61 WATER CONSERVATION GUIDELINES.

- (A) The <u>director shall recommend and the</u> city manager shall adopt water conservation guidelines[-] <u>that</u>
- [(B) The guidelines shall] include:
  - (1) policies for compliance by city departments; and
  - (2) the criteria for determining when a conservation stage takes effect or terminates. [; and
  - (3) a system designating allowed days for outdoor water use by customers.]
- (B) [(C)] The city manager shall update the guidelines if the city manager determines that changed conditions of the city's water supply system require the update.
- [(D) The guidelines shall be available for inspection at the Austin Water Utility administrative offices during normal business hours.]
- **PART 4.** Section 6-4-63 (*Permanent Water Use Restrictions*) of the City Code is amended to read:

### § 6-4-63 PERMANENT WATER USE RESTRICTIONS.

- (A) This section prescribes permanent water conservation regulations and applies year-round.
- (B) A person may not irrigate outdoors at a commercial facility except on a designated outdoor water use day, or as provided in Subsection (E).
- (C) A person may not irrigate outdoors using a permanently installed automatic irrigation system between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., except as necessary to make repairs required under Subsection (D) or as provided in Subsection (E).
- (D) A person may not:
  - (1) fail to repair a controllable leak, including a broken sprinkler head, a leaking valve, leaking or broken pipes, or a leaking faucet:
  - (2) operate a permanently installed irrigation system with:
    - (a) a broken head;
    - (b) a head that is out of adjustment and the arc of the spray head is over a street or parking lot; or
    - (c) a head that is misting because of high water pressure; or
  - (3) during irrigation, allow water:
    - (a) to run off a property and form a stream of water in a street for a distance of 50 feet or great; or
    - (b) to pond in a street or parking lot to a depth greater than one-quarter of an inch.
- (E) Subsections (B) and (C) do not apply to irrigation:
  - (1) of new landscape during installation and for one week after installation is complete if the owner provides notice in the form prescribed in the rules at least one day before installation;
  - (2) during repair or testing of a new or existing irrigation system if the person performing the testing is present; or

(3) to water nursery stock at a commercial plant nursery.

**PART 5.** Section 6-4-64 (Water Conservation Stage One Regulations) of the City Code is amended to read:

## § 6-4-64 WATER CONSERVATION STAGE ONE REGULATIONS.

- (A) This section prescribes water conservation stage one regulations and [-
- (B) This section] applies during the time periods prescribed by Section <u>6-4-62(A)</u> [6-4-62] (Effective Dates Of Conservation Stages).
- (B) [(C)] Except as provided in Subsection (D), a person may not irrigate outdoors at a residential facility or a commercial facility [using a permanently installed automatic irrigation system] between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.
- (C) A person may not irrigate outdoors at a residential facility except on a designated outdoor water use day, or as provided in Subsection (D).
- (D) <u>Subsections</u> [Subsection] (B) and (C) do [does] not apply to irrigation:
  - (1) <u>using a hand-held hose or hand-held bucket [at a single family, duplex, triplex, or fourplex residence</u>];
  - of a new landscape <u>during installation and for one week after</u> installation is complete if the owner provides [complete] notice in the form <u>prescribed</u> [established] in the <u>rules</u> [water conservation guidelines to the director] at least one day before installation; [:]
    - [(a) during the landscape installation; and]
    - [(b) during the first seven days after installation is complete;]
  - (3) during repair or testing of a new or existing irrigation system if the person performing the testing is present; or
  - (4) to water nursery stock at a commercial plant nursery.
- **PART 6.** Section 6-4-65 (D) (Water Conservation Stage Two Regulations) of the City Code is amended to read:
  - (D) The <u>designated</u> [allowed days for] outdoor water use <u>days</u> in the <u>rules</u> [water conservation guidelines] do not apply to a customer who uses [treated water effluent or raw water]reclaimed water.

**PART 7.** Section 6-4-66 (B) (Water Conservation Stage Three Regulations) of the City Code is amended to read:

(B) This section applies during a time period ordered by the city manager in accordance with Section 6-4-62 (Effective Dates of Conservation Stages).

During stage three, stage two water use management regulations in Section 6-4-65 (Water Conservation State Two Regulations) also apply.

**PART 8.** Section 6-4-66 (C) (*Water Conservation Stage Three Regulations*) of the City Code is amended to read:

(C) This section does not apply to a person who uses [treated wastewater effluent or raw water] reclaimed water.

PART 9. This ordinance takes effect on October 1, 2007.
