**MBE/WBE**: This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9C of the City Code (Minority-Owned and Women-Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore no goals were established for this solicitation.

**Prior Council Action:** 05/03/07, Adoption of the Water Conservation Task Force recommendations, Water Conservation Strategy CI-3 Conduct a cost of service study to evaluate strategies to reduce water demand. (Resolution 20070503-029)

This contract is to conduct a cost of service analyses and development of service rates for the Austin Water Utility (AWU). With the adoption of the Water Conservation Task Force recommendations, City Council mandated the AWU to conduct a comprehensive cost of service rate study by May 31, 2008.

This study will evaluate the AWU's revenue requirements, costs of providing water and wastewater service, and design rates to encourage conservation. The study will recognize accepted industry standards and be based on sound engineering and economic principles to ensure the utility costs are fairly apportioned to the customer classes, rates are fairly apportioned to the customer classes, and rates are designed to equitably recover cost. An extensive public involvement process will be conducted throughout the study process. The contractor will provide consulting expertise and services to the AWU management and staff throughout the study.
