

REGULAR MEETING THURSDAY, DECEMBER 6, 2007

Invocation: Pastor Charles Lee, Act Fellowship Church

The following represents the actions taken by the Austin City Council in the order they occurred during the meeting. While the minutes are not in sequential order, all agenda items were discussed. The City Council of Austin, Texas, convened in a regular meeting on Thursday, December 6, 2007 in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 301 West Second Street, Austin, Texas.

Mayor Wynn called the Council Meeting to order at 10:19 a.m.

The Mayor asked Council Members to report on upcoming agenda items:

Mayor Wynn announced on December 13, 2007 he will bring a proposal from Austin Energy for a process to get public input on an appropriate fuel mix for Austin Energy to help reduce the CO2 output for electricity production.

Council Member Martinez announced on December 13, 2007 he will bring an item directing staff to move forward with the recommendations for the Austin Tomorrow Comprehensive Plan implementation from the Planning Commission.

CONSENT AGENDA

The following items were acted on by one motion. No separate discussion or action occurred on any of the items. The consent items were approved on Council Member Leffingwell's motion, Council Member Martinez' second on a 7-0 vote.

- 1. Approval of the minutes of the Austin City Council from the regularly scheduled meeting of November 29,2007.
 - The minutes from the meeting of November 29, 2007 were approved.
- 2. Approve a contract with PLATIA PRODUCTIONS, Los Angeles, CA, the conference services arm of AltCar Expo, to partner with Austin Energy in planning and conducting a national conference on the subjects of Plug-In Hybrid Vehicles and Vehicle to Grid Technology in an amount not to exceed \$78,500. Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Operating Budget of Austin Energy. Recommended by the Electric Utility Commission.
 - The motion authorizing a contract with Platia Productions was approved.
- 3. Approve an ordinance authorizing acceptance of \$186,930 in cooperative agreement funds from the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and amending the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Austin Energy Operating Budget of Ordinance No. 20070910-003 to appropriate \$186,930 to establish a Solar City Partnership to promote the use of solar energy. Funding is available from the U.S. Department of Energy. Austin Energy will fund an in-kind match in the amount of \$187,000, available in the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Austin Energy Operating Budget. Recommended by the Resource Management Commission and the Electric Utility Commission.

Ordinance No. 20071206-003 was approved.

- 4. Approve the issuance of a Letter of Intent for a rebate in the amount of \$99,792 to ALORI PROPERTIES CASA DEL RIO APARTMENTS, for the installation of a solar photovoltaic system at their facility located at 3213 Red River Dr., Austin, TX. Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Operating Budget of Austin Energy in the Conservation Rebates and Incentives Fund. Recommended by the Resource Management Commission and the Electric Utility Commission.
 - The motion authorizing the issuance of a letter of intent was approved.
- 5. Approve the issuance of a Letter of Intent for a rebate in the amount of \$99,792 to ALORI PROPERTIES SAUSALITO APARTMENTS, for the installation of a solar photovoltaic system at their facility located at 4605 Avenue A, Austin, TX. Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Operating Budget of Austin Energy in the Conservation Rebates and Incentives Fund. Recommended by the Resource Management Commission and the Electric Utility Commission.
 - The motion authorizing the issuance of a letter of intent was approved.
- 6. Authorize reimbursement of costs to SPRING AUSTIN PARTNERS, LTD., a Texas Limited Partnership, for the purchase and installation of heat exchanger(s), associated piping and modifications to existing building air conditioning equipment needed to interconnect this building to the Austin Energy district cooling system in an amount not to exceed \$200,000. Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Capital Improvement Budget of Austin Energy. Recommended by the Electric Utility Commission. The motion authorizing the reimbursement of costs to Spring Austin Partners, Ltd. was approved.
- 7. Approve a resolution creating a Citizen's Water Conservation Implementation Task Force to review the water conservation implementation process and recommend changes to water conservation policies and strategies to the Resource Management Commission and City Council. There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. Recommended by the Water and Wastewater Commission.
 - Resolution No. 20071206-007 was approved with the amendment from Council Member Leffingwell to add a position for a multi-family residential representative and an additional at-large representative.
- 8. Approve an ordinance amending Section 13-1-112 of the City Code establishing speed limits on streets at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport to reflect the change of name of portions of New Airport Drive to Freight Lane and Hotel Drive, and provide for emergency passage. There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.
 - Ordinance No. 20071206-008 was approved.

Item 9 was pulled for discussion.

- 10. Approve an ordinance authorizing the acceptance of \$1,287,278 in funds from the Travis County Healthcare District; and amending the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Community Care Services Department Operating Budget of Ordinance No. 20070910-003 to appropriate \$1,666,333 in increased revenue from Medicare, Medicaid, patient fees, and other revenue sources and \$1,287,278 from an interlocal agreement with the District, and to increase the expenditures appropriated in the total amount of \$2,953,611 to add thirty and one-half full-time equivalent positions to expand Community Care Services Department clinic operations and increase the availability of healthcare for unserved and underserved patient populations. This budget amendment is in accordance with the terms of the Interlocal Agreement with the Travis County Healthcare District, as amended. Funding is available from the Interlocal Agreement with the Travis County Healthcare District and increased revenue for services.
 - Ordinance No. 20071206-010 was approved.
- 11. Approve a resolution to authorize changing the terms of City Council appointees to the Travis County Healthcare District Board of Managers. There are no expenditures incurred by the City of Austin for this action.
 - Resolution No. 20071206-011 was approved.

- 12. Approve a resolution confirming the appointment of Gerald Henderson to the Firefighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission.
 - Resolution No. 20071206-012 was approved.
- 13. Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the legal services agreement with Webb & Webb, related to franchise negotiations with Atmos Energy Corporation in the amount of \$75,000, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$115,000. Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Operating Budget of Financial and Administrative Services.

The motion authorizing the negotiation and execution of an amendment to the legal services agreement was approved.

- 14. Approve a resolution in accordance with Section 392.017(a) of the Texas Local Government Code declaring a need for the Travis County Housing Authority's purchase of the property at 502 Highland Mall Boulevard and authorizing the city manager to execute a cooperation agreement.

 Resolution No. 20071206-014 was approved.
- 15. Approve a resolution amending the City's Municipal Annexation Plan (MAP) to include the Springwoods Non-MUD annexation area (approximately 359 acres located in Williamson County between Pond Springs Road and Parmer Lane on the north and south sides of Anderson Mill Road). Including an area in the Municipal Annexation Plan does not create an obligation to annex an area and does not have a fiscal impact. It begins a three-year process that may lead to annexation.

- 16. Approve an ordinance to annex the Cantarra Section One annexation area for full purposes (approximately 62 acres in Travis County north of Gregg Lane approximately 4,356 feet west of the intersection of Harris Branch Parkway and Gregg Lane) and waive zoning application fees for property within the annexed area for a period of one year from the effective date of annexation. Funding necessary to provide general governmental services to this tract is available in the budgets of the departments which will be providing the services.

Ordinance No. 20071206-016 was approved.

Approve first reading of an ordinance to annex the Grand Avenue Parkway annexation area for full purposes (approximately 556 acres in Travis County at the intersection of IH 35 North and Grand Avenue Parkway) and waive zoning application fees for property within the annexed area for a period of one year from the effective date of annexation. Funding necessary to provide general governmental services to this tract is available in the budgets of the departments which will be providing the services. Related to item #65.

Approve an ordinance to annex the Ribelin Ranch annexation area for full purposes (approximately 201 acres in Travis County north of FM 2222 approximately 205 feet east of the intersection of FM 2222 and McNeil Drive). Funding necessary to provide general governmental services to this tract is available in the budgets of the departments which will be providing the services.

- 22. Approve first reading of an ordinance approving a regulatory plan for the River Hills Road area, which is being annexed for limited purposes. Limited purpose annexation does not have a significant impact on the general fund.

- 23. Approve first reading of an ordinance to annex the Coshena Tracts annexation area for full purposes (approximately 10 acres in Travis County west of the intersection of IH 35 North and Grand Avenue Parkway).
