## RESTRICTIVE COVENANT

PROPERTY: Tract One A 6400 acre tract of land, more or less, out of the Henry P. Hill League in Travis County, the tract of land being more particularly described by metes and bounds in Exhibit "A" incorporated into this covenant; and

Tract Two: A 2.449 acre tract of land, more or less, out of the Isaac Decker League in Travis County, the tract of land being more particularly described by metes and bounds in Exhibit "B" incorporated into this covenant; and

Tract Three A 1486 acre tract of land, more or less, out of the Isaac Decker League in Travis County, the tract of land being more particularly descnbed by metes and bounds in Exhibit "C" incorporated into this covenant; and

Tract Four A 2094 acre tract of land, more or less, out of the Isaac Decker League in Travis County, the tract of land being more particularly described by metes and bounds in Exhibit "D" incorporated into this covenant,

WHEREAS, the Owner of the Property and the City of Austin have agreed that the Property should be impressed with certain covenants and restrictions;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is declared that the Owner of the Property, for the consideration, shall hold, sell and convey the Property, subject to the following covenants and restrictions impressed upon the Property by this restrictive covenant. These covenants and restrictions shall run with the land, and shall be binding on the Owner of the Property, its heirs, successors, and assigns.

1. A site plan or building permit for the Property may not be approved, released, or issued, if the completed development or uses of the Property, considered cumulatively with all existing or previously authorized development and uses, generate traffic that exceeds the total traffic generation for the Property as specified in that certain Traffic Impact Analysis ("TLA") prepared by HDR/WHM Transportation Engıneering Consultants, Inc., dated June 12, 2007, or as amended and approved by the Director of the Watershed Protection and Development Review Department. All development on the Property is subject to the 12-13-07 \# 85
recommendations contained in the memorandum from the Transportation Review Section of the Watershed Protection and Development Review Department, dated November 29, 2007. The TIA shall be kept on file at the Watershed Protection and Development Review Department.

2 Owner reserves for the benefit of Tracts One and Two, (i) a temporary construction easement on and over Tracts Three and Four for the construction of a detention pond, various trails and retaning walls on Tracts Three and Four and, (11) temporary construction access easement across Tracts Three and Four for construction of nonvertical mprovements on Tracts One and Two; provided, however, Owner shall use commercially reasonable efforts to ensure that use of this temporary construction access easement in (ii) above does not disturb the parkland and is used as secondary access to construction on Tracts One and Two (the primary access will come from Lamar and Manchaca), and provided further, such temporary construction access easement in (ii) above shall expire on February 1, 2009 Owner shall restore any disturbed areas to their pre-existing condition.

3 Landscaping shall be provided and maintained around the detention-water quality pond located on Tract Three The landscape plan shall be submitted to the Watershed Protection and Development Review Department for review and approval. Ninety percent of the total plant material used, exclusive of turf, shall be native to Central Texas or on the Grow Green Native and. Adapted Landscape Plants list, attached as Exhibit "E" Plants on the Invasive Species/Problem Plants list, attached as Exhibit "F", may not be included
4. Pursuant to that certain Purchase and Sale Agreement dated contemporaneously herewith with the City of Austın, the Owner shall dedicate the remaining portion of Tract Four as public parkland to the City of Austin simultaneously with City's acquisition of the 0.441 acre portion of Tract Four that is the subject of such Purchase and Sale Agreement.

5 If any person or entity shall violate or attempt to volate this agreement and covenant, it shall be lawful for the City of Austin to prosecute proceedings at law or in equity aganst such person or entity violating or attempting to violate such agreement or covenant, to prevent the person or entity from such actions, and to collect damages for such actions.
6. If any part of this agreement or covenant is declared invalid, by judgment or court order, the same shall in no way affect any of the other provisions of this agreement, and such remaining portion of this agreement shall remain in full effect.
7. If at any time the City of Austin falls to enforce this agreement, whether or not any volations of it are known, such farlure shall not constitute a waiver or estoppel of the right to enforce it.
8. This agreement may be modified, amended, or termınated only by joint action of both (a) a majonty of the members of the City Council of the City of Austin, and (b) by the owner(s) of the majonty of the land area of Property subject to the modification, amendment or termination at the tume of such modification, amendment or termination
