**Subject:** Authorize award and execution of a 24-month service contract with TRIPLE D SECURITY, Austin, TX for armored car services in an amount not to exceed \$134,760, with two 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$70,749 for the first extension option, and \$74,287 for the second extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$279,796.

Amount and Source of Funding: Funding in the amount of \$33,690 is available in the Fiscal Year 2007–2008 Operating Budget of various City departments. Funding for the remaining 18 months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

Fiscal Note: There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

This contract is an annual citywide service agreement for armored car services to provide daily pickup and deposit for various City Departments. The Contractor will be required to have insurance coverage to protect City funds in case of a loss of the City's funds while in their care and possession.
