## Austin Energy RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION

**Subject:** Approve a three-year membership with CLEAN TECHNOLOGY AND SUSTAINABLE INDUSTRIES ORGANIZATION, Cambridge, MA, a non-profit organization, to partner with Austin Energy in providing technology assessments, identification of best practices, marketing and policy support in an amount not to exceed \$195,000 over three years.

**Amount and Source of Funding:** Funding in the amount of \$65,000 is available in the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Operating Budget of Austin Energy. Funding for the remaining \$130,000 is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

Fiscal Note: There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

Austin Energy (AE) is seeking approval to join the non-profit Clean Technology and Sustainable Industries Organization (CTSI), whose mission is to advance the commercialization and global adoption of clean technologies and sustainable industry practices. CTSI will also assist AE with specific policy objectives at the national level, offer marketing recognition and discounted conference and exhibit pricing, and provide targeted clean technology company identification for local recruitment efforts.
