AN ORDINANCE.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION, UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS, OF CERTAIN PROJECTS, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO MAKE APPLICATION TO THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT FOR LOANS.

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary at this time that the City of Austin undertake the construction of the certain works hereinafter named, for the reason that same are necessary in the conduct of the City's affairs, and have become desirable because such undertaking will furnish gainful employment to a large number of persons who are now unemployed; and

WHEREAS, under the National Industrial Recovery Act of Congress, the United States Government proposes to lend its funds to the various municipalities for the construction of public works, and it is necessary that the City of Austin borrow from the Government the funds sufficient for its proposed undertakings; therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

SECTION 1. THAT in event the City of Austin can borrow from the United States Government,
as provided under the National Industrial Recovery Act, the funds necessary for the expenses thereof, the following projects and works are hereby determined to be undertaken by

(1)	Construction of service building annex to Water, Light and Power Plant -	\$1 50,000.00
(2)	Construction of raw water pump-house and pump at Water, Light and Power Plant -	60,000.00
(3)	Installation of screen-house and intake tunnel for raw water, at Water, Light and Power Plant -	45,000.00
(4)	Purchase and installation of new high service pump, at Water, Light and Power Plant -	13,000.00
(5)	Construction of 6,000,000 gallon settling-basin, as additional to the present settling facilities, and large head-house, and installation of lime unloading and feeding equipment, at Water Filtration Plant -	100,000.00
(6)	Construction of Spray Pond at Water, Light and Power Plant -	75,000.00
(7)	Construction and installation of 7,500 KW Steam Turbo Generator, and one 10,000 sq. ft. Surface Condenser and auxiliaries at Water, Light and Power Plant -	275,000.00

(8)	Repairs to boiler settings of present 750 H.P. Boilers, at Water, Light and Power Plant -	\$ 15,000.00
(9)	Construction and equipment of underground Electric Distri- bution System, down town area, in connection with Water, Light and Power Plant -	350,000.00
(10)	Construction of Sewage Treatment Plant, including pump plant, dry beds, filters, Imhoff tanks, etc	450,000.00
(11)	Extensions to Water Distribution System, in connection with Water, Light and Power Plant -	160,000.00
(12)	Sanitary Sewer Extensions and Laterals -	175,000.00
(13)	Nurses Home, at, and adjunct to, Brackenridge Hospital -	31,500.00
(14)	Double Bituminous surfacing on streets -	150,000.00
(15)	Public Market Building	52,500.00
(16)	Low Water Dam, adjunct to W & L Plant -	250,000.00

SECTION 2. THAT the City Manager of the City of Austin be and he is hereby empowered, authorized and directed to cause plans and specifications to be made for the various works enumerated above, and that he cause applications to be made through the proper channels to the United States Government in behalf of the City of Austin for loans, severally and in the aggregate, to cover the costs of the various projects enumerated above; and that he furnish such data and do such work as may be required by the United States Government authorities to properly present said applications and to consummate such loans for such purposes.

AN ORDINANCE

(Repealed-Book "K", p.40)

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING PERSONS, FIRMS, AND CORPORATIONS TO ENGAGE IN BUYING AND SELLING FRUITS AND VEGETABLES AT WHOLESALE WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, REQUIRING THE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES, PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES, EXEMPTING IN PART CERTAIN PERSONS, DEFINING TERMS, PROVIDING ENFORCEMENT, PRESCRIBING DUTIES OF ENFORCING OFFICERS, PROHIBITING THE SUPERSEDING THEREOF BY OTHER ORDINANCES, PROVIDING FOR THE DISPLAY OF LICENSES, FIXING PENALTIES, DESCRIBING OPERATING AND EFFECT.

WHEREAS, fruits and vegetables are now being sold at wholesale in the City of Austin which are inferior in quality, unfit for human consumption, mixed in grade, and sold as of a higher grade; and

WHEREAS, fruits and vegetables are stored, kept, packed and sold in wholesale establishments which are kept in unsanitary conditions, and therefore dangerous to the health of the public; and
