

RESOLUTION NO. 20080424-063

WHEREAS, the City of Austin Street Smarts Task Force convened March 29, 2007 to transform Austin into a world class bicycling city; and

WHEREAS, the City of Austin's bicycle network is incomplete; and

WHEREAS, bicycle facilities provide both transportation and recreational opportunities that enhance Austin's high quality of life; and

WHEREAS, the City of Austin is proactively planning and implementing bicycle facilities corridors; and

WHEREAS, Education, promotion, law enforcement and safe behavior must also be considered; and

WHEREAS, the City of Austin is working towards a balanced, equitable and efficient transportation system that provides a range of transportation choices, reinforces the livability of neighborhoods, supports a strong and diverse economy, reduces air and water pollution and lessens reliance on the automobile while maintaining accessibility; and

WHEREAS, the benefits of making bicycles an integral part of daily life include healthier residents; reduced traffic congestion, parking demand, energy use, air pollution; and transportation costs; more efficient use of land and road space; and increased personal mobility and community livability; and

WHEREAS, encouraging and enhancing the use of alternative transportation, including bicycles, is a goal of the Austin Climate Protection Plan, and

WHEREAS, the bicycling community contributes significant economic benefits to the City of Austin, including numerous bicycle-related businesses, major events such as the Ride for the Roses, nearly daily year-round bicycle rides and activities, tourism, bicycle racing, and the attraction of new residents and families to Austin because of our bicycle-friendliness; **NOW, THEREFORE**,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That with passage of this resolution the City of Austin establishes its intent to become the first Texas city to attain Gold level bike-friendly status from the League of American Bicyclists; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the City Council of the City of Austin supports the work of the Street Smarts Task Force January 2008.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:
