Whereas, held Gates is a very poor colored man , and, as suc, worthy of compassionate consideration, therefore,

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

That the sum of \$ 17.50 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the general contingent fund of this City, to be paid to said Gates, as an act of public compassion to cover the damages sustaine dby him in said flood, but it is distictly understood upon the part of the Officials of this City and upon the part of said gates, and so publicly stated by him to this Council, that said appropriation constitutes no precident either in his favor or in favor of any other citizen foe payment or acknowledgement of liability for damages upon the part of this City for floods arising from any cause in or about the premises of said Gatesor any where on east seventh street between Comal and Concho streets.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote:
