Whereas, on the 5th day of January, A D 1910, J W Graham filed a certain plat for record in the effice of the County Clerk of Travis County, Texas, which said plat is recorded in the plat records of Travis County, Texas, in book No 2 page 191; and,

Whereas, said plat purports to dedicate a certain strip of land as a street, same being a continuation westwardly of twenty-eighth street from its intersection with San Pedro street to the east line of anorth extension of San Cabriel street and lying between Outlots 65 and 66, Division "D" of the City of Austin; and,

Concton, Co-Operalave . Whereas, it has been represented that said plat has been in the possession of J W Graham for over thirty years, during which time same has not been recorded until the date above named, and during which time the said strip of land shown on said plat has not in any part been used as a street, and same is not now used as a street; and,
