For line from 24th to 27th streets, take the center of Lampasas street as found by the above method at the north line of 24th street, and a point on the south line of 27th street 37 feet east of the present fence corner of Bahlberg property 8 W corner of Lampasas and 27th streets.

The latter line makes an angle of approximately ten minutes (10') with the former line.

This streamer is to be suspended at an elevation of not less than twentt five feet above the street level . It is to be suspended only upon consent of the property owners in front of which it is to be erected, and if the use of the trolly line pole is desired consent of the Austin StreetRailway Company must be obtained.

This streamer will hear upon its face in little flags the words " Carnaval , April Sth to lath " .

The work to be done under this permit must be done under the supervision of the City Engineer.

This permit is temporary and subject to revocation at any time at the pleasure of the City Council .
