Nagle on the improvements on 52 feet by 200 feet on West Avenue of District 6, Div. 3, as said assessment was erroneously made from a copy from the year 1911. Said improvements were entered on the rolls at a value of \$1200.00, when it should have been \$400.00, as no additional improvements were on said property on Jan 1st 1912.

Fire limits
Ordinance

Councilman Stark presented an Ordinance
establishing the Fire limits in the City of Austin, and
prohibiting the erection within the Fire limits of buildings
out of material other than is provided for in this
Ordinance; the removal and repairing of a certain class
of buildings, and regulating the building of fences and
the storage of combustible material within the Fire limits;
and providing a penalty for the violation thereof.
The ordinance was read the first time.
