

Regular meeting of the City Council: Austin, Texas, April 2nd 1914:

The Council was called to order by the Mayor: Roll called:

Present Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmen Anthony, Bartholomew, Haynes & Powell 5

The minutes of the last regular and subsequent recessed meetings were read and adopted:

Reports of City Officers:

The Mayor laid before the Council the report of the City Marshal, the City Engineer and the Supt in charge of the construction of the City Hospital, which were read and ordered filed.

Councilman Haynes offered the following resolution :

Whereas, improvements on lots 14, 15 & 16, Block "C" outlet 39, Division "C", Driving Park Addition to the City of Austin, were assessed on its unrendered roll for 1913, at \$ 6.00.00, when in fact said improvements cost about \$ 50.00,
