construct its gas mains in and upon the following streets:

(1) A gas main in FREDERICKSBURG ROAD, beginning at a point 20 feet south of the south line of the Barton Springs Road and 28 feet west of the new center line of the Fredericksburg Road;

Thence in a southerly direction with the center line of a gas main, which center line shall be 28 feet west of and parallel to the new center line of the Fredericksburg Road, for a distance of 100 feet.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 21 feet.

(2) A gas main in WEST FOURTEENTH STREET, from Palma Plaza easterly approximately 328 feet, the center line of which gas main shall be 48 feet south of and parallel to the north line of said West Fourteenth Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 22 feet.

When the Texas Public Service Company requires definite information upon the ground as to elevations or working points from which to base the location of their assignments, they shall apply to the City Engineering Department not less than three (3) days before such information is required. The Texas Public Service Company is further put upon notice that they will be required to bear the expense of repairs or replacement of any underground utility damaged during the construction of lines named in this resolution.
