REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Austin, Texas, October 22, 1942

The City Council convened in regular session, at the regular meeting place in the Council Chamber at the Municipal Building, on Thursday, October 22, 1942, at 10:30 A. M., with Mayor Tom Miller presiding. Roll call showed the following members present: Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; absent, none.

There were present also: Walter E. Seaholm, Acting City Manager; Gibson R. Randle, Acting City Attorney; J. E. Motheral, City Engineer; and R. D. Thorp, Chief of Police.

The Minutes of the regular meeting of October 15, 1942, were read, and upon motion of Councilman Alford, were adopted as read by the following vote: "yes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "no," none.

D. B. Johnson, representing the Junior Chamber of Commerce, submitted a request for assistance in its annual campaign for eradication of rats by having leaflets printed for mailing out with water and light bills, calling attention to such eradication campaign and advising method of securing poison for same. The matter was referred to the Acting City Manager for compliance with said request, after consulting with said D. B. Johnson as to proper wording of leaflets.

The application of Jess George Vasquez, 1003 West 11th Street, for a taxicab driver's permit, approved by the Acting City Manager, was submitted. Councilman Bartholomew moved that the application be granted. The motion prevailed by the following vote: "yes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "no," none.

The application of Joyce William Baker, 324 West 6th Street, for a taxicab driver's permit, approved by the Acting City Manager, was submitted. Councilman Bartholomew moved that the application be

granted. The motion prevailed by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "nays," none.

The application of Lloyd Gerald Davis, 509 West 8th Street, for a taxicab driver's permit, approved by the Acting City Manager, was submitted. Councilman Alford moved that the application be granted. The motion prevailed by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "nays," none.

The application of J. A. Reed, 1303 Chestnut Avenue, for a Wine and Beer permit for the Dew Drop Inn, 1133 East 11th Street, duly approved, was submitted. It was moved by Councilman Alford that the application be granted. The motion prevailed by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "nays," none.

Following a discussion of the matter with Dr. Harold Wood, Acting City Health Officer, on the urgent necessity for same, Mayor Miller laid before the Council the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THAT CERTAIN ORDINANCE PASSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS, JULY 1, 1937, BEING AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SALE OF MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS WITHIN THE CITY OF AUSTIN, WHICH ORDINANCE IS RECORDED IN BOOK "K", PAGES 201-215, OF THE ORDINANCE RECORDS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, BY ADDING A NEW SECTION THERETO, NUMBERED SECTION 8-A, WHICH PROVIDES THAT THE CITY HEALTH OFFICER SHALL HAVE THE POWER, DURING AN EMERGENCY, TO PERMIT THE SALE OF UNGRADED MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN; REQUIRING A TEMPORARY PERMIT THEREFOR; REQUIRING PASTEURIZATION THEREOF; PRESCRIBING MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING FOR LABELS THEREON; REGULATING THE PASTEURIZATION PROCESS; REQUIRING THAT CERTAIN RECORDS BE KEPT; GIVING THE CITY HEALTH OFFICER POWER TO REVOKE TEMPORARY PERMITS ISSUED HEREUNDER; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The Ordinance was read the first time and Councilman Gillis then moved that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance be placed on its second reading. The motion prevailed by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "nays," none.

The Ordinance was then read the second time and Councilman Gillis moved that the rules be further suspended and the Ordinance be placed on its third reading. The motion prevailed by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "nays," none.

The Ordinance was then read the third time and Councilman Gillis moved that the Ordinance be finally passed. The motion prevailed by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "nays," none.

The Mayor then declared the Ordinance finally passed.

The application of Freeman Freddie Lambeck, 1909 Chicon Street, for a commercial pilot's permit was submitted. Councilman Bartholomew moved that the permit be granted, subject to approval of the Lake Austin Navigation Board. The motion prevailed by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "nays," none.

It was moved by Councilman Gillis that a half-rate for water and light be granted to the Salvation Army, 516 Colorado Street; the Lutheran Service Center, 907 Congress Avenue; the Baptist Service Center, 103 1/2 East 7th Street; the Central Christian Church Service Center, over 203 Congress Avenue; and such other church or benevolent organizations operating without profit for the entertainment of the soldiers. The motion prevailed by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf; "nays," none.

Upon motion, seconded and carried, the meeting was recessed at 11:30 A. M., subject to call of the Mayor.
