REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Austin, Texas, March 4, 1943

The City Council convened in regular session, at the regular meeting place in the Council Chamber at the Municipal Building, on Thursday, March 4, 1943, at 10:55 A. M., with Mayor Tom Miller presiding. Roll call showed the following members present: Councilmen Alford, Bartholomow, Cillia, and Mayor Miller; absent, Councilman Wolf.

There were present also: Walter E. Seaholm, Acting City Manager; J. E. Motheral, City Engineer; J. M. Patterson, Jr., Acting City Attorney; and R. D. Thorp, Chief of Police.

The Minutes of the Regular Meeting of February 25, 1943, were read, and upon motion of Councilman Alford were adopted as read by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, and Mayor Miller: "nays," none: Councilman Wolf absent.

The application of Charles Gilbert Moody, 1615 Congress Avenue, for a taxical driver's permit, which had been recommended for denial, was submitted. After a consideration of the facts in the case, it was moved by Councilman Alford that the said Charles Gilbert Moody be granted a probationary taxical driver's permit for ninety (90) days, and that applicant be instructed to report to the

Chief of Police every thirty days in the meantime. The motion carried by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, and Mayor Miller; "nays," none; Councilman Wolf absent.

NAMED AND THE PROPERTY OF THE

The following ordinance was introduced by Mayor Miller:

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING A GENERAL ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING FIVE COUNCILMEN OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS BEGINNING MAY 1. 1943, DESIGNATING THE POLLING PLACES IN THE VARIOUS WARDS, AND PROVIDING THE PROCLAMATION OF SAID ELECTION.

The ordinance was read the first time and Councilman Bartholomew moved that the rules be suspended and the ordinance be passed to its second reading. The motion was seconded by Councilman Alford, and was carried by the following vote: "ayes," Councilman Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, and Mayor Miller; "nays," none; Councilman Wolf absent.

The ordinance was then read the second time and Councilman Alford moved that the rules be suspended and the ordinance be passed to its third reading. The motion was seconded by Councilman Gillis, and was carried by the following vote: "ayes," Councilman Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, and Mayor Miller; "nays," none; Councilman Wolf absent.

The ordinance was then read the third time and Councilman Gillis moved that the ordinance be finally passed. The motion was seconded by Councilman Bartholomew, and was carried by the following vote: "ayes," Councilman Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, and Mayor Miller; "nays," none; Councilman Wolf absent.

The Mayor then declared that the ordinance had been finally passed.

Councilman Alford offered the following resolution: (RESOLUTION)

WHEREAS, The Texas Public Service Company has conducted a leakage survey on East 9th Street from Congress Avenue to Brazos Street; and

WHEREAS, Numerous gas leaks were found which are hazardous to the general public; and WHEREAS, The Texas Public Service Company has requested permission to cut the pavement in the aforementioned block at twelve-foot intervals in order to repair loaks at each bell joint, and also to cut the pavement and sidewalk area at all service locations in order to make the necessary repairs to their gas main; and

WHEREAS, Said company has agreed to repair said street and sidewalk area in accordance with the direction of the City Engineer, and to pay all expenses incidental to the restoration of said pavement and sidewalk area; and

WHEREAS, Said request has been reviewed and considered by the City Council of the City of Austin; Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

THAT the Texas Public Service Company be permitted to cut the pavement in East 9th Street from Congress Avenue to Brazos Street at twelve-foot intervals in order to repair leaks at each bell joint, and also to cut the pavement and sidewalk area at all service locations in order to make the necessary repairs to their gas main.

Upon motion of Councilman Alford, the foregoing resolution was adopted by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, and Mayor Miller; "nays," none; Councilman Wolf absent.

The application of Tom Alexander Hill, colored, 1111 East 13th Street, for a taxicab driver's permit, duly approved by the Acting City Manager, et al., was submitted. Councilman Alford moved that the application be granted. The motion carried by the following vote: "ayes," Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, and Mayor Miller: "nays," none; Councilman Wolf absent.
