

Minutes of a Meeting of the City Council.
Austin Texas March 9th 1866.

Chas. Lewis Franklin, Mayor, presiding.

Council called.

Present, Alderman Fisher, George W. Glass, Haynes, Fletcher, Sawles, Sims, Mitchell, Clark, Powell, Predd, Gardner, Lump, Townsend and Silver; 15 Aldermen, Alderman County, C. H. Brown, Schmid, Shelley, Sargent and John. Alderman Townsend moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes and have them be adopted as printed. Carried.

Petitions:

Petition of G. McEachron
for damages sustained

Petition of G. McEachron asking the Council to pay him for damages to wagon and team caused by falling off a bridge in the city, was read and on motion of Alderman Sims, was referred to the Committee on Claims and Accounts.

On motion Alderman Sims was excused from further attendance at this session of the Council.

Alderman Shelley and Taylor appeared and answered to their names. Alderman Lawrence presented a petition of D. J. Safenart asking permission to erect a corrugated iron building and fence on Block #50, City. Granted.

Alderman Dealey entered the Council Chamber and answered to his name.

Petition of citizens of the Tenth Ward asking that Navasota street be opened was read, and on motion was referred to the Street Committee. Petition of Mrs. S. C. business house situated on one of the abutting lots, which purpose is unobjectionable, the language of the ordinance is so broad that the right is therefore given to the railroad company to use for any purpose, and the lot would thus become the property of the City or the railroad company. Of this, one at least, of the abutting owners seriously objects, and the railroad company itself does not seem so general a grant. The objects sought can be accomplished by granting the right to the railroad to use for specific purposes, in which case it would rather benefit than injure the abutting property, and would be altogether more effective.
