

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council.
Austin Texas May 3rd 1891.

Minutes adopted as recorded. On motion of Alderman Maddox the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as recorded without reading.

Mayors Message

The Mayor then laid before the Council the following message:

Mayors Office

Austin, Texas May 3, 1897.

To the Hon. City Council,

Gentlemen: I have the honor to call your attention to the propriety of making some provision for the care of the City Teams while they are idle. At present they have to be fed at considerable expense to the City, though they are doing nothing. This is a useless expense. I recommend that by resolution you authorize the Superintendent of Streets to pasture all of the teams, or at least all except one or two, when not in use. I further recommend that you make it the duty of the Superintendent of Streets to take charge of the City Prisoners and to work them on the streets, in conjunction with the one or two city teams above referred to.

I would further call your attention to the dangerous condition of the river bridge at the foot of the Avenue, and remind you that nothing has been done toward determining the respective duties of the City and County, and that meanwhile the City interests are endangered. The City Engineer constantly examines it and makes such repairs as seem of immediate necessity, but such piecemeal work is far from meeting the requirements of the case.

I would further call your attention to the accompanying letter from the Attorney of C. L. Bartholomew, Receiver.

Dear Sir:

We Atty's for C. L. Bartholomew, Receiver &c. against Jas. McDonald Mayor &c. being C. 1780 in the Circuit Ct. of the W. S. Western District of Texas, at Austin, for mandamus &c., we respectfully call your attention to the judgment rendered in said case, on the 10th day of March, 1896.

We further call your attention to the fact that the mandate of said Court, in said case, has not been complied with.

The Court convenes on the 1st Monday in July coming.

While we wish to make no application for orders in that case, against the defendants therein, yet, if said work of mandamus has not been done in its plain spirit intent and purpose, by the time Court convenes, there will be nothing left for us to do except to appeal to the law! to enforce its plain and explicit judgment in the premises; by such means as at most, we are, however, bound to adopt, and endeavor.

We give you, and the other defendants, due time, notice with the hope that you and your wife, do, in necessary steps, the whole of this business.
