Drill Company, New Austin Gas Light and Co., Company and Merchant C.,
the right to build, maintain and operate a station (air road) over certain streets of the City.

The ordinance was read first time, and on motion referred to the ordinance committee.

Act. of W. George Conwin, acting Alderman of 1st Ward, by permission, presented a petition from C. J. and Co. (co. of horses), users of City teams. Conwin, noting, for the use of two of the City teams, with certain tools to open up street recently dedicated to the City by John H. Maddox and wife, the petitioners to furnish and pay for drivers and labor.

On motion the petition was granted.

Act. of L.C. Lock acting 2nd Ward. One Mayor laid before the Council a petition from L.C. Lock, asking for grant of fine reward permission of a part of fine assessed in the Recorder's Court against it against Disney Lock in the sum of \$100.

Said petition was recommended by the Recorder and the Mayor, and on motion, the petition was granted.

Alderman Taylor moved that when the Council adjourn, it adjourn until 8 o'clock p.m., Tuesday, March 8th 1898, which motion prevailed.

Minutes of an adjourned regular Meeting of the City Council.
Austin, Texas. March 8th 1898.

The Council was called to order by his Honor, the Mayor.

Roll called.

Call of Council ordered. Alderman Crook moved a call of the Council, which was seconded.

Roll called.

Absent: Aldermen Delvin, Fischer, McLeone, Miller, Nitschke, Read,

Robertson and Zilker. 8.

The Marshal was directed to bring in the absentees.

Ex-Mayor Hancock invited Upon motion of Alderman Maddox, ex-Mayor Hancock, who was present
was invited to address the Council upon the matter of the settlement
of the judgment of E. C. Bartholomew, Receiver, against the City.

Ex-Alderman Linn invited Mr. Hancock addressed the Council, after which Ex-Alderman Linn,
by invitation, addressed the Council on the same subject.

Aldermen Delvin, Miller, Read, Robertson and Zilker entered the
Council Chamber.

Alderman Robertson moved to excuse Aldermen Fischer and McLeone,
which motion prevailed, by the following vote:

Platt, Powell, Read, Robertson, Rosengren, Shelley, Stumpf, Taylor, Town-
send and Zilker 17.

Nay, Alderman Horton and Maddox 2.

Alderman Morris moved to suspend the call of the Council, which
motion prevailed.

Alderman Maddox moved that the pending business be suspended
for the present. Adopted.

Alderman Morris moved that the budget adopted by the Council on
the 23rd day of February, 1898, be amended by adding to it the following:
"To pay the first installment and interest due on same, upon the judg-
ment recovered against the City of Austin by E. C. Bartholomew, Receiver,
etc," which motion prevailed.

On motion of Alderman Powell, Aldermen Morris, Maddox, Platt and
Special Com^t appointed to go and talk, together with the City Attorney and the Mayor, were appointed
substitute for Ord. now pending. A Committee to prepare a substitute to the ordinance under consider-
ation to meet the views of a majority of the Council present.

On motion of Alderman Delvin, the Council took a recess of ten minutes
to allow the Committee to prepare and present their report.

After the recess, the Council was called to order.

Alderman Morris, for the Special Committee, presented a substitute
for the ordinance under consideration, being an ordinance appropri-
ating the sum of \$11,500. to pay the first installment and interest
of the judgment recovered by E. C. Bartholomew, Receiver, against
the City of Austin.

Alderman Maddox moved to adopt the bill, which motion prevailed.

Ord. passed.

The ordinance was then read third time and passed by the following vote:
