

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council.
Austin Texas (April 18th, 1898).

Hon. (no. D) W. C. Cole, Mayor, presiding.
Roll called.

Present Aldermen Bentz, Crozer, Barnes, Nichols, Mc Lamore,
Morris, Scott, Powell, Proskryew, Shultz, Taylor, Townsend and Gilmer; 13
Absent Aldermen Belvin, Fischer, Norton, Cahn, Miller, Kitchner,
Padd, Robertson and Stumpf. 9.

Alderman Taylor moved that the Council have a recess of 10 minutes
which motion carried.

At the end of the recess the Council was called to order.

Alderman Norton and Robertson entered the Council Chamber.

Alderman Taylor moved that the minutes of the last meeting
meeting adopted as record be approved be recorded without reading. Carried.

Aldermen Fischer, Belvin, Miller and Padd entered the
Council Chamber.

Petitions, etc.

Pet. of Geo F. Roswell to have by Alderman Bentz. Petition of Geo. F. Roswell to have certain
certain County fees refunded. Board fees refunded. On motion of Alderman Gilmer Mr.
Roswell was invited to make a statement explaining the petition.

Alderman Stumpf entered the Council Chamber.

Alderman Scott moved that the amount of \$25.00 be refunded to
Mr. Roswell, being the amount collected by the City for Board fees
paid by him, and that a Special Committee of 3 be appointed to
investigate charges made for Board fees charged, which motion
prevailed, and the Mayor appointed Aldermen Scott, Norton and
Miller, as the committee.

On motion the Mayor was directed in the name of the City
Council to extend an invitation in accordance with the com-
munication.

The Mayor laid before the Council a petition from Morris
Givens asking authority to redeem certain property from
his wife. On motion the petition was referred to the Claims
and Accounts Committee.

Reports of City Clerks.

City Clerk and Recorder. The Clerk laid before the City Council a report from the
Clerk, Clerk, who has initiated a Bill in the Legislature to
Vice President, the same date in the year 1898, for the
year 1899, defining the office of City Clerk in the City of Austin, Texas, and
the powers & duties of such office.

On motion of Alderman Farlow, the report was re-committed to the City Attorney with the request that he obtain from the Assessors and Collector a list of all persons affected by said report, and report back to the Council.

The Mayor then laid before the Council the report of the City Attorney, on the petition of Geo. L. and Mary McDonald, asking the City to furnish to them a bond of what is known as "River Walk" stating that he was of the opinion that the petition should not be granted. The report was adopted.

The City Clerk reported that in accordance with the resolution of the Council he had written holders of Water & Light Bonds, asking for bids to furnish \$10,000.00 bonds for the Drinking Fund, and that he had received only one bid, which was as follows:

Alderman Farlow offered the following resolution:
"Resolved, that the Mayor and Finance Committee be and they are hereby directed to purchase Thirteen Water & Light 5% Bonds of the City of Austin, at a cost not exceeding 107 and accrued interest."

Alderman Maddox offered as a substitute for the resolution, a motion that the matter be deferred until the next regular meeting. The substitute was adopted.

Police Commissioner's report on City Marshal's reports for March 1898, presented a report stating that the reports had been examined and found correct. Report adopted.

Ord. & Street Comt. report on Alderman Shelleys, for the Ordinance and Street Committees' Ord. granting H. & C. Ry. Co. right-of-way to lay certain side tracks in the City, presented a report, recommending the passage of the ordinance, with an amendment. The report was adopted.

A motion was made to suspend the regular order of business and take up the ordinance granting right-of-way, etc., to the H. & C. Ry. Co., which motion was lost.

Alderman Shelleys, for the Ordinance Committee, for whom was engaged, an ordinance granting to the Sanitary Sewer Co. the use of the H. & C. Ry. Co. right-of-way, authorizing the said company

After statement by Mr. Luck, a vote was had on the motion to adopt the report of the Committee, and the motion was lost by the following vote:

Alderman Silver was excused from voting.

Claims & Accts. Comt. report on Alderman Blatt, for the Claims and Accounts Committee, to whom was referred the ac't. of G. Myrick, City Treasurer, for Commissions, Exchange etc., in payment of interest on Bonds, presented a report recommending the payment of the ac't.

On motion the report was adopted.

Alderman McDemore for the Printing Committee, presented the following report:

Printing Comt. report on To the Hon. John D. McCall, Mayor, and
bid for Newspaper printing by Board of Aldermen of the City of Austin.

Gentlemen: - Your Committee on Printing, to whom was returned the bid of the Statesman Publishing Company to publish the Council Proceedings, etc., with instructions to advertise for new bids, have complied with said instructions, and have received bids from the following papers:

The Daily Statesman, The Evening Tribune, The Evening News, and the Texas State Democrat.

Your Committee requests that the different bids be read before this Council, and recommend that that of the Evening News be accepted, that paper agreeing to print the Proceedings and any other matter the Council may wish to publish at one twenty-fourth of one cent per word each insertion, which is considerably lower than any of the other bids.

Your Committee would also recommend, that the paper awarded the contract, be required to give a good and sufficient bond in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.) to be approved by the Mayor, for a faithful compliance with the terms of its contract.

Unfinished Business:

The Mayor laid before the Council the following veto message, which was read:

Mayor's Office,

Austin, Texas, April 11th 1898.

To the Honorable City Council:

Gentlemen:

I herewith return to you an ordinance passed by you on April 4th 1898, entitled, "An ordinance to amend Articles 6 and 9 of Chapter 7, Title 1 of the Revised Civil Ordinances of the City of Austin", with my disapproval of the same, and my reasons therefor as follows: The ordinance proposes to repeal the following provisions in the law, "Provided, however, that in no case shall any warrant be issued by the Mayor, or the City Treasurer, unless an appropriation for the specific purpose of paying the same shall have been previously made by the City Council, and unless the Mayor shall have received information in writing from the City Treasurer, that there is sufficient money in the treasury, exclusive of all amounts otherwise specifically appropriated by ordinance to pay such warrant."

This in my opinion, is a wise and wholesome provision in the law, and should not be disturbed.

It acts as a check or reminder that we must keep our expenditures within our income, and this fact cannot be emphasized too much.

We, as the Agents of the people, should administer their affairs economically, and give a strict and accurate account of how we are spending their money, and in doing this, we should have all the safeguards necessary to help us in accomplishing this end.

I am opposed most emphatically in contracting debts that we do not see our way clear to pay.

For this reason and others that could be urged, I am opposed to the measure.

Alderman Sheller moved to strike out in line 11, Sec. 1, the words, "or more," which motion prevailed.

On motion the rule was suspended, and the ordinance placed upon its 3rd reading and final passage, by the following vote: Aldermen Beale, Devin, Crooker, Haynes, Maddox, McLemore, Miller, Morris, Nitschke, Platt, Powell, Read, Roberdeau, Rosengren, Shelley, Stumpf, Taylor, Townsend and Gilker 10.

Nays. Alderman Norton 1.

That ordinance was then read a third time and passed.

The Mayor then laid before the Council an ordinance granting to the South Star Ice Co., the Austin Gas Light and Coal Co. and build the track to South Star Telephone Co., the right to build, maintain and operate a single line of Railroad, on certain Streets in the City.

Alderman Morris moved to postpone action on the ordinance until the next regular meeting, which motion prevailed by the following vote:

Yea, Aldermen Norton, Maddox, Miller, Morris, Nitschke, Platt, Powell, Read, Roberdeau, Shelley and Townsend 11.

Nays Aldermen Beale, Devin, Crooker, Haynes, McLemore, Rosengren, Stumpf and Taylor 8.

New Business.

Bill from Water & Light Plant, for Water & Light

The Mayor laid before the Council a bill from the Water Works, Electric Light & Power Plant of the City of Austin, for Water and Light and Power for the past 12 months amounting to \$14,964.00. One motion of Alderman Powell, the bill was referred to the Water and Light Committee.

Aldermen McLemore and Townsend were excused from further attendance at this session of the Council.

Resolution directing City Eng. by Alderman Roberdeau, Resolution authorizing the City to dispose of old lumber. Original to dispose of the old lumber taken from the Hall from East Austin Fire Hall of East Austin Fire Co., to Messrs. Dill and Ulm, for \$7.00.

The resolution was adopted.

Resolution, extending thanks by Alderman Haynes. A resolution that the thanks of the Council be extended to the management of the Evening Tribune Management. Secd. for making it possible for the City to have the official proceedings printed equitably free, as a matter of news.

The resolution was read the following day.
