

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council.

Tuesday, December 19<sup>th</sup> 1898.

The petition was read, and on motion was granted.

Alderman Crooker entered the Council Chamber.

#### ~~Reports of Standing Committees~~

Fin. Comt. report on Alderman Morris for the Finance Committee, presented a report stating that  
resolution to purchase the Committee in pursuance of a resolution of the Council had purchased \$10,000.00 Bonds for Thousand Water and Light Bonds of the City, for the Sinking Fund, said Bonds  
Sinking Fund being \$10,000.00 both numbers inclusive, and now presented the said bonds  
Bonds presented to the Council, for such action as they might take with them, the said bond  
being for \$10,000. having been canceled.

Alderman Hayes moved that a Committee be appointed to take charge of the bonds  
Committee, &c., and that the word "canceled" be written across the face of said bonds, and that  
pointed to with them be filed with the City Treasurer, which motion prevailed, and the Mayor

Fin. Comt. report on Alderman Morris for the Finance Committee, reported that in accordance with an  
Ord. to purchase ordinance passed Aug. 22<sup>nd</sup> 1898, they had purchased for the Sinking Fund on bonds  
Bonds for Sinking Fund prior to May 1<sup>st</sup> 1890, \$1000. 5% Water and Light bonds of the City, which  
Bonds prior bonds were now in the hands of the City Treasurer to the credit of said fund.  
to May 1<sup>st</sup> 1890 The report of the Committee was adopted.

Fin. Comt. report on Alderman Morris for the Finance Committee to whom was referred the petition  
of L. A. Logard asking the Council to exchange 4 good Water and Light Bonds of  
exchange within the City, for 4 of said Bonds that were slightly damaged, he paying all expenses.  
Bonds that had of said Exchange, presented a report, stating that they could see no objection to  
become damaged making the Exchange, and therefore recommended that the Mayor, City Treasurer,  
City Clerk and Finance Committee, be requested to make said Exchange and  
that they make a full report to the Council of said Exchange, giving the numbers  
of bonds exchanged, that a complete record of the transaction shall appear in the  
minutes of the Council, provided the bonds proposed to be exchanged by Logard,  
are not so mutilated that same cannot be fully identified.
