

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council.
Austin, Texas, May, 16th, 1898.

Hon. Geo. D. McCall, Mayor, presiding.
Roll called.

Present: Aldermen Beatty, Crocker, Clinton, Maddox, Morris, Platt, Powell, Shirley,
Stumpf, Taylor, Townsend and Gilmer 12.

Absent: Aldermen Belvin, Fisher, Haynes, Kuhn, McSamore, Miller, Vitchez,
Reed, Robertson, and Rosengren 10.

Alderman Taylor moved the adoption of the minutes as recorded without reading.

Alderman Maddox demanded reading.

The minutes were read and adopted.

Aldermen McSamore, Haynes, Miller, Reed, Kuhn, Vitchez and Belvin, entered the
Council Chamber.

Petitions.

Recd. from Dr. Dearbrough & Sticks the Mayor laid before the Council a petition from Dearbrough & Sticks asking
to have assessment of reduction of their assessment for the year 1897.

Read and referred to the Claims and Accounts Committee.

Reports of Standing Committees.

Police Committee: Alderman Powell for the Police Committee, to whom was referred the reports
of the City Marshal, for the month of April 1898, presented a report stating
that the reports had been examined and found correct. The report was adopted.

Claims & Accounts Committee: Alderman Platt, for the Claims and Accounts Committee, to whom was referred
the petition of W. H. Harrington, asking a reduction of his assessment for taxes for
1897, as fixed by the Board of Equalization, presented a report, stating that the Council
had no authority to grant the relief asked, and therefore recommend that the
petition be not granted. The report was adopted.

Unfinished Business.

Ord. to allow Mrs. L. B. The Mayor laid before the Council an ordinance directing the City Assessor and
Collector to allow Mrs. L. B. Pease a credit of \$1158.92 on taxes for 1897.

The amount thus allowed being taxes illegally collected from her for the year 1897.

The ordinance was read third time.

City Attorney's report: The Mayor laid before the Council the following report from the City Attorney:

The City Assessor and Collector reports that the amount of money collected
from persons and property brought within the City limits by the amended Charter
of 1897, upon the assessment of that year, is \$14,956.49.

Alderman Platt moved that the ordinance do now pass.

Alderman Taylor moved as a substitute, that the ordinance be referred to the
Finance Committee, which motion prevailed by the following vote:

Recd. from Mr. J. C. Stumpf, the Mayor laid before the Council, an account from the Water & Light Plant of the
City, for Water & Light, to Sept. 30th, 1898.

Alderman Taylor moved that a special committee of three be appointed, to adjust the amount due the Water and Light Commission by the City, for water and light furnished. Alderman Nitchee moved as a substitute, that the matter be referred to the Water and Light Committee, which motion prevailed.

Alderman Delvin was excused from further attendance at this session of the Council. Rentals of Telephones Alderman Morris stated that rentals for the Telephones used by the City from and onward to \$¹ per mo after May 1st 1898, would be \$1.50 each.

W^m Milby's name Alderman Morris moved that hereafter the name of W^m M^{ilby} be placed upon the regular pay roll of Officers and employees, which motion prevailed.

Pay roll of Officers Alderman Morris was excused from further attendance at this session of the Council.

Bridges on Long Av. com Alderman Nitchee stated that the Bridges to be built on Congress Avenue would not be built.

City Engineer directed to Alderman Nitchee moved, that the City Engineer be directed to send the four Miles belonging to the City, and not in use, to a pasture, which motion prevailed.

Alderman Rosengren entered the Council Chamber.

Ord.[#] 1926. To pay Alderman Morris, An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$1926.20 to pay approved accounts.

The ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote:

Ord.[#] 115⁵ to pay Extra Sanitary labor. By Alderman Morris. An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$115.50 to pay for extra Sanitary labor.

The ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote:

Alderman McLemore was excused from further attendance at this session of the Council.
Ord.[#] 18⁵. To pay Extra Street labor for December 1897. By Alderman Nitchee. An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$18. to pay extra street labor for December 1897.

The ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote:
Cas. Aldermen Beatty, Crooker, Haynes, Norton, Shum, Maddox, Miller, Nitchee, Platt, Powell, Redd, Rosengren, Shelley, Stumpf, Taylor, Townsend and Gilker 17.
Nays. None.

Ord.[#] Amend Article H & Chap 2 Title 1 Rev. Civ. Ord. By Alderman Maddox. An ordinance to amend Articles H and Q, Chapter 2, Title 1 of the Revised Civil Ordinances of the City of Austin.

The ordinance was read first time, and a motion made to suspend the rule and place the ordinance on its second reading, was lost by the following vote:

Cas. Aldermen Beatty, Crooker, Haynes, Norton, Shum, Maddox, Miller, Platt, Powell, Redd, Rosengren, Taylor, Townsend and Gilker 14.
Nays. Aldermen Nitchee, Shelley and Stumpf 3.

Alderman Maddox offered the following resolution, which was read and adopted:
Be it resolved, by the City Council of the City of Austin; That the City Attorney be and he is hereby instructed to investigate and report to this Council, the rights of the City to the State front now being used by private persons for wharf purposes, boat houses, etc., and to suggest such measures as may be necessary and legal, for the protection of the public, in behalf of Sam McDonald.

Alderman Taylor offered the following resolution:

Inviting Rice
Twy. to speak reg'd
of State front rights

Res. to purchase
to W&L 5% Bonds
for drainage \$100.

Resolved: That the Mayor and Finance Committee be and they are hereby directed to purchase Ken Water and Light 5 percent Bonds of the City of Austin, provided same can be had at a cost not exceeding par, and accrued interest.

Alderman Powell moved to adjourn. Lost.

Moved to meet at Alderman Shelley moved that the Council meet hereafter at 8:30 o'clock, instead of 8:30 a.m. motion carried.

The vote was then taken on the resolution of Alderman Taylor, and the motion was lost by the following vote:

Ord. for \$1,700 to build by Alderman Deasy. An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$1,700 for the purpose of building bridges on West Second and Fifth Streets and Congress Avenue.

The ordinance was read first time, and a motion made to suspend the rule and place the ordinance on its second reading, was lost by the following vote:

Yea. Aldermen Deasy, Crooker, Kuhn, Blatt, Powell, Rosengren, Shelley, Stumpf,
Townsend and Gilmer 10.

Nay Aldermen Haynes, Norton, Maddox, Miller, Nitschke, Bradd & Taylor y.

Ord. for \$233¹¹ to pay by Alderman Nitschke. An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$233¹¹ to pay expenses Rec't Street Dept. Approved accounts of Street Department.

The ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote:

Yea. Aldermen Deasy, Crooker, Haynes, Norton, Kuhn, Maddox, Miller, Nitschke,
Blatt, Powell, Bradd, Rosengren, Shelley, Stumpf, Taylor, Townsend and Gilmer 10.
Nay None.
