Reports of Standing Committees.

Finance report Alderman Morris, for the Finance Committee, to whom was referred an Ord. to pay Mrs. C. Brase a credit on taxes for 1897 of \$1158.92 this being the amount illegally collected illegally paid by her on taxes for 1891, presented a report recommending that the ordinance do not pass, for the reason that the City cannot at this time, spare this sum from the General Revenue. The report of the Committee was adopted.

Alderman Delvin Walker entered the Council Chamber. Alderman Hayes excused.

Police Committee Alderman Powell, for the Police Committee, to whom was referred the reports of City Marshals, for the month of June, presented a report stating that the reports had been examined and found correct. The report was adopted.

The Chair laid before the Council a report from the Wateright Commission to whom was referred the bill of the Austin Water Light & Power Co., of May 1st, 1898. The bill was returned to the Council because not within the jurisdiction of the Commission. They also returned to the Council the petition of Citizens to

have a boom constructed across the mouth of Bull Creek, which had been referred to them, without any report. The matters were then referred to the Water & Light Committee.

Unfinished Business:

The Chair laid before the Council, an ordinance prohibiting appropriations being made when there was not money in the Treasury to pay same.

The Chair laid before the Council a report from the City Attorney on the deed to the City, from the Executrix of the estate of Rev. H. Wisdom deceased, to certain ground for Street purposes. On motion the Ord. was accepted, and the City Clerk directed to have same recorded.

New Business:

Reconsideration of Ord. Alderman Norton moved to reconsider the vote had at the last session of the Inc. adapting its acts Council, adopting the report of the Claims and Accounts Committee upon the Compt. on pet. of petition of Scarborough & Hicks asking the Council to annul and set aside the Scarborough & Hicks action of the Board of Equalization in raising their assessment for the year 1897 on goods, wares, etc., the motion prevailed. Mr. Scarborough being present, was invited to address the Council in behalf of the petitioners, after which Alderman Delvin moved that the petition be referred to a Special Committee of four, which motion prevailed, and the Chair appointed as the Committee Aldermen Delvin, Maddox, Taylor and Gilker.

The ordinance was read first time and on motion was referred to the ordinance Committee Ord. granting permit by Alderman Kirschke, by request. Resolution granting permit to Geo. Dennis, to administer within exhibit in the City, at No. 600 East 6th Street concert performances of the nature or variety theatrical performances of Variety Theatrical performances under certain conditions.

The resolution was read; and on motion was referred to the Police Committee and City Attorney.

Aldermen Delvin, Crooker, Horton, Shulm, Maddox, Miller, Morris & Kirschke, Flatt, Rosengren, Shelley, Stumpf, Taylor and Gilker. 14.

Bill from H.S. & P. Chancery. The Chair laid before the Council an account of the Water Light & Power for McAlpined plant, of the City, for Water & Light furnished the City to July 30th 1898.

On motion the account was referred to the Water Light Committee.

Ord. Appro^t setting aside part of Taxe^s of part of the Taxes levied and collected for the year 1898 under the head of Fund to pay Int. upon H.L. Bonds. An ordinance appropriating and setting aside that part of Taxe^s of part of the Taxes levied and collected for the year 1898 under the head of General Revenue, which was intended to pay interest and provide sinking fund upon Water & Light Bonds. Read first time and referred to the Finance Committee.

Ord. sinking H.L. Bonds by Alderman Taylor. Resolution instructing the Mayor and Finance Committee to allow to purchase New Water & Light Bonds of the City of Austin at the best bid obtainable. Read and on motion referred to the Finance Committee by the following vote: Geas. Aldermen Delvin, Crooker, Horton, Shulm, Miller, Morris, Kirschke, Rosengren, Shelley and Stumpf 10.
Stays. Aldermen Dealy, Maddox, Flatt, Taylor and Gilker 5.

Alderman Dealy moved to reconsider the vote had, whereby the Council refused to suspend the rule and place the ordinance appropriating the sum of \$121³⁸ to pay approved accounts Street Department on its second reading, which motion prevailed.

A motion was then made to suspend the rule and place the ordinance on its second reading, and was lost by the following vote:
