By Alderman Nolen. Petition of Citizens of South Austin for a
public passway through certain property in the eastern part of
the first Ward - Read and referred to the Street Committee

By Alderman Fischer. Petition of the Athletic Council of the
State University for permission to close a portion of Tom Green
Street. Read and on motion laid over to come up with an
ordinance on the same subject under the head of new business

By Alderman Stumpf. Petition of Citizens of the 4th Ward, asking that
the ground ordinance be enforced in certain limits; road included
in the ordinance, but not enforced. On motion Mr. Marshall

was directed to have the ordinance enforced as requested

By Alderman Glass. Petition of G. M. Davis et al to have the
Alley opened in Block 7088 of the City. Read and on motion
referred to the Street Committee

By Alderman Glass. Petition of Mrs. Gans regarding a certain
drain pipe and asking that the same be attended to. Read and
on motion referred to the Street Committee and City Engineer
with authority to act.

Alderman Fischer offered the following resolution

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin,
That the Street Committee is hereby instructed to advertise
for bids for a bridge in South Austin, Appropriation for
same having been made some time ago. Resolution read
Alderman Fischer moved to amend by adding "that the
Committee be authorized to advertise for said bids in the
Statesman and Tribune." The amendment was
adopted and the resolution as amended passed.

Alderman Dunham offered the following resolution, which
was read and adopted. Resolved that the sum of \$11.00 be
refunded to W. H. Jones, paid by him during the present month
as penalty for 11 head of cattle grazing within the City.

By Alderman Fischer. Petition of the Austin City Cemetery
Association, asking certain changes as to fines to be charged
by them for Cemetery lots. Read and on motion referred
to the ordinance and Cemetery Committee

Alderman Fischer offered the following resolution which was
read and adopted. Be it resolved by the City Council of the
City of Austin, that the City Engineer is hereby instructed

to employ a driver for the extra team of the City
Alderman Glass presented a bill from Mrs Eva Cantorberry for
rent of ground for an electric light pole, which was read and
upon motion referred to the Water Light Commission.

Alderman Mortiman presented the following resolution
which was read and adopted

Resolution Amend Section 10 of an ordinance regulating
the running at large of dogs. passed May 15th 1899, and approved
May 19th 1899 to read. The City Council is hereby authorized to
elect a dog catcher & one assistant for the months of June,
July, August and September of each year at a monthly salary
of \$50.00 for "dog catcher" & \$30.00 for assistant to carry out the
provisions of the above sections

Alderman Mortiman offered the following resolution which
was read and adopted Be it resolved that for the good
of the Police department, that the City Marshall be and
is hereby granted permission by the City Council to have
Telephones at the expense of the City placed in his and three
(3) mounted Policemen houses.

The following resolution by Alderman Mortiman was read
and adopted Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of
Austin, that the City Assessor & Collector be and is hereby
Authorized to issue duplicate dog tags to each owner of a
dog or dogs upon which the dog registration fee or fees
have been paid for any particular year upon affidavit being
Made to said assessor & collector that the tag or tags issued for
that year have been lost by or stolen from such owner

The following resolution by Alderman Glass, was read & adopted
Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin that Col. Shirley
additional pay be and is hereby allowed the sum of fifteen dollars per month
for serving the City Council during their meetings at night -
which services he is now performing without pay at present time

Reports of Standing Committees

Alderman Glass for the Committee on Sanitation and Sewerage to whom was referred an ordinance prescribing regulations for the removal of trash, refuse &c. presented a report recommending the passage of the ordinance.

The report of the Committee was adopted.

Alderman Fischer for the Hospital Committee stated that Hospital Com. the Hospital Committee desired the opinion of the City to confer with Attorney as to who were entitled to be admitted as patients at that institution, whether the Hospital was for the benefit of citizens of the City of Austin and Travis County, or if it was open to the public generally.

Alderman Strumpf moved that the Hospital Committee be authorized to confer with the County authorities and that they formulate a set of rules for the Government of the Hospital, which motion prevailed.

Unfinished business

The Mayor laid before the Council and Ordinances prescribing regulations for the removal of ordinary refuse, trash and sweepings from business and residence premises in the City of Austin and fixing the penalty for violation of said regulations, together with a favorable report of the Committee on Sanitation and Sewerage. The ordinance was read the second time.

Alderman Glass offered an amendment to be known as Section 1½. providing that for business and residence premises on Congress Avenue and between the Capital and First Street and on Sixth Street between each and West Avenue they be required to use a uniform sized Metalic Can for the reception of sweepings etc from their premises and that the City furnish a system of the can required -

On motion of Alderman Glass the Council took a recess awaiting the report of the Committee

The Council was called to order by the Mayor. Alderman Martinen for the special Committee presented a verbal report asking further time in which to make their report.

On motion further time was granted the Committee
