To the Honorable City Council

City of Austin Texas

Gentlemen: At a meeting of the Water, Light and Power Commission held September 19th 1899, the following resolution was passed

"Resolved that the attention of the City Council be called to the fact that the franchise of the Austin Water, Light and Power Company to erect poles and wires in the streets and alleys of the City expired on the 3rd day of October 1897, with the request that such steps, as may be necessary, be taken to remove said poles and wires from the streets and alleys"

The Mayor laid before the Council the ordinance to put in
operation the Corporation Court

Alderman Dunham moved to postpone further consideration
of the ordinance until the next regular meeting of the
Council which motion prevailed

The Mayor laid before the Council the following Message

Mayors office Austin Tex October 2nd, 1899

To the Honorable City Council

I have the honor to present the

Name of Mr Frost Robinson Jr., to be a member of the Board
of Equalization of the City of Austin

There are other taxpayers who would doubtless make good members of the Board. The names of some of these were presented, but were not acceptable to the Council. I have no desire except to work in harmony with the Council. If by any chance the Board should not give satisfaction, then the responsibility would rest with the Mayor, and not the members of the Council.

In Nomination & Section 30, pages 13 and 14 of the City Charter, says that the Board shall be appointed by the Mayor, and confirmed by the City Council. As it is my duty under the Charter to appoint the members of the Board, I have presented the name of Mr. Robinson, who, in so far as I can learn, is acceptable to the people.

Alderman Glass moved that the Council vote upon the matter of Confirmation by ballot which motion prevailed and the Mayor appointed Aldermen Fischer & Nolan as Tellers. The tellers announced the following as the result of the ballot: For Confirmation 3 against Confirmation 0. Not Voting 1. The Alderman not all voting a new ballot was ordered. The tellers announced the following as the result of the second ballot:

For Confirmation 1. against Confirmation 6.

The Mayor laid before the Council the bill of the Water Bill with Power Works, Electric Light and Power Plant of the City of Austin, for water & light furnished to Sept 30th 1899, which was read and referred to the Water & Light Committee.

By Alderman Fischer An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$1450.00 to pay approved accounts

The ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote

Yea Alderman Dunham Fischer Glass Morris Martinen
Nolan and Stumpf
Nays None

Mayor authorized Alderman Glass moved that the Mayor be authorized to buy a car to purchase one car of oil for sprinkling streets, which motion for sprinkling streets prevailed - Alderman Morris excused from further attendance.

Alderman Martinen moved that a leave of absence for 15 days be granted to Marshall Thorp - which motion prevailed

Alderman Glass offered the following resolution which was read and adopted

Whereas some of the citizens of Austin are still assing water in sprinkling our streets from City Water, blank which we believe at this time of the year and on account of the scarcity of water can be discontinued without any serious inconvenience.

Now Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin
 that the Water & Light Commission be requested to compel
 the discontinuance of the use of water for spraying purposes
 until the supply of water be sufficient for the necessary supply
 of citizens of Austin and that the Clerk be requested to notify
 the Water & Light Commission of the passage of this resolution.

Alderman Glass offered the following resolution

"Whereas the City Council of the City of Austin has no
 power to appellee immediate control of the Water & Light Plant of the City of
 Austin and that the present Water and light Commission has
 signally failed to perfect and improve the plant as originally
 intended by the citizens of Austin

And we believe it would be more satisfactory to the people
 of the City that they look into and examine the present unfa-
 -tunate conditions themselves by a representative Committee
 appointed from the best citizens of Austin.

Now Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin - that
 the Mayor be and is hereby required to appoint a Committee
 of thirty from the representative citizens of Austin to examine into
 the conditions of the water and light plant of the City with full
 power to act in the examination of persons and papers accounts
 and such other matters as may be advisable - to administer
 oaths - Compel attendance of witnesses and make a thorough
 examination of all matters connected with the water and light
 plant of the City - Also to make such recommendations as they
 may deem necessary to the further improvement of the plant
 and such other recommendations as they may see fit to make

Alderman Glass moved the adoption of the resolution - which
 motion was lost

By Alderman Ellington an ordinance regulating the
 dog ordinance running at large of dogs and providing for the registration of
 same and fixing a penalty for the violation of the regulations hereby
 established - The ordinance was read the first time and a motion
 made to suspend the rule and place the ordinance on its second
 reading which was lost by the following vote
