Whereas during the present year the City Water Light- <sup>appoint Com.</sup>  
Plant has been compelled to shut down on two certain <sup>to investigate</sup>  
occasions because of the insufficiency of a supply of water <sup>Wd. Plant,</sup>  
with which to operate the machinery, and,

Whereas each shut down causes much trouble, expense  
and anxiety among the citizens of Austin and militate seriously against the growth and development of the City,  
Whereas the recurrence of such conditions can be guarded against by supplementing the present water light and power plant of the City by an auxiliary stream plant.

Therefore be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin that a Committee of Citizens consisting of Messrs Jas. R. Johnson Edward Sanderson D. A. McFall and Hilliard Treadwell be requested to meet with the

Water Light Committee of this Council in an advisory capacity and that said joint committee look into and investigate thoroughly the present conditions surrounding the City Water Light-Plant the necessity for supplementing same and the best available method for doing and report their findings and recommendations to this Council at the earliest practical moment consistent

with a thorough and complete investigation of the matter.  
Be it further resolved that the City Clerk be directed to forward to  
each citizen herein requested to act on said advisory Committee  
with a copy of these resolutions duly attested.
