Austin Texas August 20th 1900

Call called

On Motion the Minutes were approved as
recorded by the Clerk without reading.

Petitions, Memorials etc

The Mayor laid before the Council a petition from S. A.
McCulloch asking that he be allowed to pay taxes for 1898
on which suit had been brought and judgement rendered
by paying the tax, with interest and penalty, and that
the costs be remitted - Alderman Glass moved that
the petition be referred to the Committee on Claims & accounts -
Alderman Fischer moved as a substitute that the petition
be not granted - The substitute was adopted

The Mayor laid before the Council a petition from E. Mayon
Guardian & Mrs Eva Henkels, a petition asking that the
assessment on certain lots belonging to the estate of
E. Henkels be reduced. On Motion the petition was
referred to the Committee on Claims & accounts.

By Alderman Glass Petition of A. S. Hansen President and
A. Branks Secy of Colorado Hose Co No 2, asking that
the amount deducted from salary of John Wallace of said Co
during the time the Company was suspended by the
Chief of the Fire Dept, be paid him. On Motion the
petition was granted and the Clerk directed to place the
amount in the ordinance to pay approved accounts at
the next meeting

Alderman Fischer for the Street Committee presented the following communication which was read and adopted
To the Hon'ble Mayor and City Council of the City of Austin

In view of the fact that the City Authorities have purchased a Road Roller and Grader. We respectfully call your attention to the fact, to get the best service with these tools, we recommend the employment of some practicable road builder, to act as Street Commissioner who shall have control of all street forces as it is expedient that we should get a system, in our street work, and as our City Engineer has not the time to attend to all this work

Alderman Mortimer offered the following resolution
which was read and adopted

Whereas the Council, by an ordinance which became
effective on the 17th day of August 1900, repealed the tax levy
for 1899, of one dollar upon each one hundred dollars worth of
property situated within this City and subject to taxation for
the purpose of paying interest on and creating sinking fund
for the outstanding Water & Light bonds of the City and
tax for 1899. Whereas the Auditing Committee of the City is still in session,
therefore,

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin:
Section 1 That said Auditing Committee is hereby instructed
to make out and file in the office of the City Clerk an
itemized list of all tax payors who have not paid said tax;
and said list shall show the amount of the tax in each case;
and said Committee shall report its action hereunder to the
Council

Section 2 That when said list shall have been filed the Auditing
Committee shall credit the account of the City Collector with
the amount of taxes shown by said list to be unpaid by reason
of said repeal

Alderman Nolen offered the following resolution which
was read and adopted

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin: That the
City Engineer and the City Marshal be and are hereby
instructed to have removed all electric light and other
poles on Congress Avenue south of the Colorado River to the
outside of the railing along said highway and to prevent in
the future the erection of such poles within said railing

The Mayor laid before the Council the following
communication

Austin, Tex August 8th, 1900
Hon G.W. McCall Mayor
Dear Sir:

Bonds Nos 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 issued
by the City, for the purpose of building a High School. Not
having been used, and now in your hands, and not being
needed in the construction of the High School building.
I am instructed by the Board of Trustees, to ask the City
Council to have the same & the coupons attached thereto
Cancelled and destroyed.

to destroy the bonds & coupons mentioned, which motion
prevailed and the Mayor appointed Aldermen Fischer
and Glass as such Committee.

The special Committee appointed to Compt and in Corrooch
to destroy the 10 high school Bonds & Coupons, presented
a report stating that they had compared the report
and bonds and had found same correct and had
burned the bonds & Coupons in the presence of the
Council. The report was read & ordered filed.
