Our Report To the Hon Mayor & Aldermen of the City of Austin!

Your Special Committee appointed to canvas
the election for Alderman of the 2nd Ward held on Oct 6, 1900,
beg leave to report that the returns of the
election show that B. E. Pillard received 320 Votes
and that J. P. Schneider received 750 Votes.

We find that no returns have been sent in from the
4th Ward but we are informed that the returns
are in the ballot box from that ward, and we ask
that the Council authorize the Committee to open the
box and count the returns

H. C. Kolen for Committee

Committee Alderman Mortimer offered the following resolution
authorized to be voted which was read and adopted

caused by the Resignation of Alderman Mortimer.

The Mayor appointed Aldermen Glass and Dunham
as such Committee -

The Committee appointed to introduce the newly elected
Alderman presented Mr J. P. Schneider to the Mayor & City Council
and after the administering of the oath of office to him by the
Hon the Mayor he was escorted to his seat in the Council

The Mayor announced that he had appointed Alderman
Schneider to serve on all Committees made Vacant by the
resignation of Alderman Morris - on in other words he takes the
position on Committees held by Alderman Morris
