

# Regular Meeting of the City Council

Austin, Texas, January 7th, 1901.

Hon. W. A. Glass, President of the Council, presiding.

Roll called

Present: Alderman. Durstane. Glass. Mortimer. Holin. Schmid & Stumpf - 6  
Absent: Alderman. Fischer. - 1

On motion the minutes were approved as recorded by the Clerk without reading.

## Petitions, Memorials, etc.

By Alderman. Mortimer. Petition of Jas. H. Robertson Esq., asking permission to put in a switch or spur track from the yards of the Houston & Texas Central Railroad Company in Block 30, across Braggs street to and across the back end of Lots 19 and 11, block 31, of the city.

The petition was read and on motion was laid over to come up with a resolution on the subject under the head of new business.

By Alderman. Glass. Petition of Mrs. Uctilla, asking to have certain funds paid referred. On motion the petition was granted.

By Alderman. Stumpf. Petition and proposition of Chas. Stevenson, for exchange of property. Read and referred to Street Commissioner and engineer.

By Alderman. Glass. Petition of J. C. Bangs, asking refunding of certain ground fees. On motion the petition was granted.

By Alderman. Mortimer. Petition of Lewis Hill, asking to have a fine assessed against him in the Mayor's Court, remitted. The petition was read, and on motion was granted.

By Alderman. Glass. Communication from T. G. Doe, complaining of the condition in which the streets were left by contractor for street work in the Sixth and Seventh wards, and asking that the Council take steps to have same put in good condition. On motion the petition was referred to the street Commissioner and City engineer with authority to act.

By Alderman. Glass. Petition of Ira H. Evans, receiver of the Austin and Waco RR Co., Pacific Coast Railroad Company, asking correction of assessment to come up for the year 1898. Read and referred to the claims and accounts committee.

## Reports of City Officers.

The chair laid before the council the reports of the City officers, for the month of December, 1900, which were, on motion referred to their appropriate committees without reading, except the report of the Treasurer, which was read.

## Reports of Standing Committees.

Alderman Stumpf for the street Commissioner, to whom was referred the petition of M. W. Shipe asking that certain drain pipes be put in, and that the steam roller be furnished, when needed, and an appropriation for \$500.00 made to aid and in completing the sidewalk from 19th street to Hyde Park. Presented a report recommending that the petition be granted. On motion the report was adopted.

Alderman. Stumpf for the Finance Committee, to whom was referred the proposition of Mr. J. W. Walker ridge to sell certain walls and light houses of

in City, presented a report, recommending that the proposition be accepted. On motion, the report was adopted.

Alderman Stearns for the Finance Committee, to whom was referred the proposition of W. L. White to purchase certain land from the City, presented a report recommending that the proposition be referred to the Water, Light and Power Commission of the City. The report was adopted.

Alderman Dunham for the Printing Committee presented a report, stating that the Corroville had advertised and received bids for the City printing for the year 1901, and recommending the acceptance of the bid of the Stateman Publishing Company for newspaper printing, and the bid of Von Beckmann Schutz & Co. for commercial printing. On motion the report was adopted and the Mayor authorized its entry into contract with the parties, in accordance with their respective bids.

Alderman Mortimer, for the Committee on Purchases, presented a report Purchasing Committee stating that in conformity with the law governing same, they had advertised for bids for supplies for hospital, etc., and begged leave to report that we recommend the following bids be accepted:

Various groceries for hospital, as per specifications filed with City Clerk, to Grinn & Buck, W. R. Smith, and Fischer Bros.; Pewter pipe at J. Martin & Sons; Wood for Hospital, J. W. Beard; Fuel for City teams, Robinson & Bros.; Feeding prisoners, Jas. Adams; Dry Goods, W. R. Smith; Meat Men Ulrich; Mathews and Gillows, J. S. Collins; On motion the report was adopted.

Alderman Dunham called up from the table the report of the Auditing Committee and referred it to the Finance Committee, to the Finance Committee.

#### New Business.

Resolution, quoting Alderman Mortimer offered the following resolution, which was referred to the Finance Committee and adopted:

Robinson, 6th in R.R. track, and Rivers 1st lot  
Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin. That the petition of Jas. H. Robertson asking permission to construct a rail-road track across Brazos Street, from Block 30, to and across the south end of lots 19 and 21 in Block 31 of said City, be and the same is hereby granted, and the said Robertson or his lessees or vendees, are hereby granted permission to construct, under the supervision of the City engineer and Street Commissioner of the City of Austin, a spur or switch railroad track from the yards of the Houston and Texas Central Railway Company in Block 30, across Brazos Street, to and across the south end of Lots 19 and 21 in Block 31, to be used by the said Robertson or his lessees or vendees or the Houston and Texas Central Railway company, solely for the purpose of passing cars over said track in delivery and removal of freight to and from said lots.

This privilege is granted, upon the condition that the said Robertson and the person constructing said track, across said street shall hold the City harmless from all damages that may result to any person by reason of the construction of said railroad track across said street.

That this resolution take effect from and after its passage.

By Alderman Stearns in ordinance authorizing the sum of \$300 for the purpose of purchasing belt and making down for road.

Austin Hose Company. The ordinance was read the first time and on motion was referred to the Fire Committee.

By Alderman Stumpf: An Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$100<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of having rolls bearing arms placed on Protection Hose wagon.

The ordinance was read the first time, and on motion was referred to the Fire Committee.

By Alderman Stumpf: An Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$200<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of riding in the Constitution of the Hyde Park Sunday, from 19th. until to Hyde Park.

The ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote:

Yea: Alderman Dunham, Glass, Mortimer, Nolen and Stumpf.

Nay: Schneider

By Alderman Schneider: An ordinance to furnish owners of real estate and personal property purchased by the City of Austin at foreclosure sale, to redeem the same at any time within ninety days from the passage of this ordinance.

The was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote:

Yea: Alderman Dunham, Glass, Mortimer, Nolen, Schneider and Stumpf.

By Alderman Stumpf: An Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$174<sup>75</sup> for the purpose of paying approved accounts, Fire Department.

The ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote:

Yea: Alderman Dunham, Glass, Mortimer, Nolen, Schneider and Stumpf.

Nay: Now

<sup>Resolution introduced</sup> Alderman Stumpf: offered the following resolution, which was read and adopted. City engineer to file  
Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, that the city engineer shall team, mowing his and is hereby instructed to place the said teams at work mowing the approaches to the bridge on West 5th. Street, where same crosses Congress Avenue, Dug Long Ave, and to continue said teams at said work from the time said bridge is completed until said approaches are also completed.

By Alderman Stumpf: An Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$1,600<sup>77</sup> for the purpose of paying approved accounts.

The ordinance was read the first time and on motion the rule was suspended and the ordinance placed on its second reading by the following vote:

Yea: Alderman Dunham, Glass, Mortimer, Nolen, Schneider and Stumpf.

Nay: Now

The ordinance was read the second time.

Alderman Glass moved to amend the ordinance by adding the following:

J. A. Range, for pound fees refunded \$1<sup>00</sup>. Achilles, for pound fees refunded \$1<sup>00</sup>; Lewis Still, fine in Mayor's Court, refunded \$1<sup>00</sup>.

The amendments were adopted, and the ordinance as amended was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote:

By Alderman Stumpf: An Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$1,71<sup>75</sup> for the purpose of paying the salaries of Special Justices for the month of November, 1900. The ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote:

Yea: Alderman Dunham, Glass, Mortimer, Nolen, Schneider and Stumpf.

Nay: Now

By Alderman Schneider: An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$210<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of making closer connection with City Hall and City Market.

The Ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following Vote:

By Alderman Nolen: An Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$1,950<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of rettling, the team wagon of the French Austin Horse Company.  
 The Ordinance was read the first time and on motion was referred to the fire committee.  
 By Alderman Stumpf: An Ordinance, appropriating the sum of \$1,300<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of purchasing bonds for the sinking fund of the Water and light bonds of the City.

The Ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following, Vote:

Yeas: Alderman, Dunham, Mortimer, Nolen, Schneider, and Stumpf . 5.

Nays: Alderman, Glass . 1.

By Alderman, Glass: An Ordinance appropriating the sum of \$500<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of completing bridge and approaches across Waller Creek on East 5th street on Waller Creek.

The Ordinance was read the first time and on motion was referred to the street committee.  
 Alderman Nolen offered the following resolution:

"Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, that the street committee of the Council be and is hereby instructed to at once submit to the Commissioners Court of Travis County, the following proposition for obtaining for the use of the City, the County road teams for the next three months. Viz: The City will take charge of said teams, for said period, pay all expenses for properly keeping same, pay the pay roll for the force working same, and return all of said property to the County at the expiration of said time, in as good condition as when received, ordinary wear and tear excepted." The resolution was adopted by the following vote:

Yeas: Alderman, Dunham, Mortimer, Nolen, Schneider, and Stumpf . 5.

Nays: Alderman Glass . 1.

The chair laid before the council.

Communications from Hon: F. L. Campbell, assistant secretary of the interior, Washington D. C. and from Hon: A. J. Dawson, member of Congress from this district, acknowledging receipt of copy of resolution passed by the honorable city council on December 17, 1900, and stating that the matter referred to in the resolution would have attention. Alderman Glass moved that the communication be referred to the Water and Light Commission, which motion prevailed.

On motion the council adjourned.
