

Regular Meeting of the City Council

Austin Texas, August 19th 1901.

Hon. R. B. White Mayor presiding.

Roll called.

Present: Alderman. Hume. Maddox. Mortimer. Nichols. Redd.
Schneider. Shelly. Stumpf and Ullet. 9.

Absent: Alderman. Crook. Davis. Gillis. Low. and Shumate. 5.

On motion of Alderman Maddox, the minutes were approved, as recorded
without reading.

Memorials. Petitions etc.

At 4 P.M. By the Mayor: Petition of G. M. Brass. asking change in certain streets.
Read and on motion referred to the Street Committee.

At 4.30 P.M. By Alderman. Nichols. Petition of B. L. SoRelle asking to have certain
Founds paid by him, refunded. Read and referred to the Committee
on claims and accounts.

Regular order suspended.
Alderman. Maddox, moved to suspend the regular order of business
and to take up and consider: An Ordinance granting authority
to the H & C. R. R. Co. to put in certain switches etc. Which motion prevailed.

Alderman Davis entered the Council Chamber.

At 4.45 P.M. By Alderman. Maddox: An Ordinance, granting the Houston
and Texas Central R.R. Co. permission to change certain side tracks,
construct others and to construct Brick passenger stations, Austin.

The Ordinance was read the first time, and on motion the rule
was suspended and the Ordinance placed on its second reading
by the following vote: Yeas. Alderman. Davis. Hume. Maddox. Mortimer.
Nichols. Redd. Schneider. Shelly. Stumpf and Ullet. 10.

Nays: None. 0.

At 5 P.M. Alderman Shumate entered the Council Chamber.

The Ordinance was read the second time. Alderman Davis
moved to amend by adding at the end of section 3: the following
"and approved by the City Engineer and Street Committee".

Amendment adopted. The amendment was adopted, and a motion made to sus-
-pend the rule and place the Ordinance on its third reading
and final passage, which motion prevailed by the following, Vote:
Yeas: Alderman. Davis. Hume. Maddox. Mortimer. Nichols.
Redd. Schneider. Shelly. Shumate. Stumpf and Ullet. 11.

Nays: None.

The Ordinance was read the third time and passed unanimous-
ly. The Council returned to the regular order of business.

At 5.30 P.M. By the Mayor: Petition of Isaac Olds, asking to have certain
Founds paid, by him refunded.

Report of City Officials.

The Mayor laid before the Council report of the City Engineer on
construction of W. F. Houston and W. E. Hinsler, also a wheel taking
that he had laid out and painted certain numbers 100.

Report of Standing Committees.

Alderman Shelley for the Claims and Accounts Committee, presented the following reports. On the petitions of Mrs. J. J. Orr, A. P. Scott, H. C. Frazee and W. C. Harwood, to have certain Pound fees refunded, they recommend that the petitions be granted, and the petition of Mrs. S. E. Whipple asking correction of Assessment for 1900. They recommend that the petition be granted. The several reports of the committee were adopted.

Alderman Crookshank entered the Council Chambers.

Alderman Stumpf for the Ordinance Committee, to whom was referred the memorial of W. Von Rosenberg Jr. Esq^r. regarding the putting into operation the Corporation Court of the City of Austin, presented a report. Stating that at this time they did not think it advisable to put the court in operation.

The report of the Committee was adopted.

Alderman Stumpf for the Ordinance Committee to whom was referred a Resolution for the creation of Special Committee to be known as the Committee on permanent street improvement, presented a report recommending that the resolution "do not pass." The report of the Committee was adopted.

Alderman Shelley for the majority of the Police Committee to whom was referred an Ordinance, prescribing details for the Mayor's report organization of the Police force, presented a report, recommending the passage of the Ordinance, with an amendment proposed by the Committee.

Alderman Stumpf for the minority of the Committee, presented a report recommending that the Ordinance "do not pass."

Alderman Stumpf moved to adopt the minority report which motion was lost by the following vote:

Alderman Nitschke moved that the report lie over to come up with the Ordinance, under the head of unfinished business. Which motion prevailed by the following vote:

Alderman Schneider for Social Committee to whom was referred the communication of the Non Commissioners Court, presented a report of the Court, stating that it is the opinion of the Committee that all wire should be placed under said bridge or on the abutments and trees. On motion the report of the Committee was adopted.

Unfinished Business.

The Mayor, laid before the Council, an Ordinance, prescribing details for the organization of the Police force of the City of Austin. The Ordinance was read the second time and a motion made to postpone the same and return it on the third reading and final passage. Was lost by the following vote:

New Business.

Ord. Apr. 1st. By Alderman Maddox. An Ordinance to permit owners of real estate, purchased by the City of Austin, at foreclosure sale, to redeem the same at any time within ninety days from the taking, effect of this Ordinance, by paying to the City Tax Collector, the amount of the taxes due, and court costs and all penalties, with interest from the date when such sum became due at six per cent per annum, together with all taxes penalties, and interest that may be due on same. The Ordinance was passed under suspension of the rules by the following Vote:

Motion of Crooksh. On motion of Alderman. Shelly. The Receiver and Collector, was directed to give notice through the public forces, that the City now had Cemetery lots on Sale.

^{Res. to repeal} Alderman. Schneider offered the following resolution.

From Ord. Be it Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Austin; that I abolish all Pound Ordinances, of the City, be and are hereby repealed of Pound Master and that the office of Pound Master, be and is hereby abolished. Alderman. Mortimer moved to lay the Resolution on the Table, which motion prevailed.

10. On motion of Alderman. Shelly. leave of absence, for ten days, absent for City beginning on the 2d inst. Was granted to the City Clerk.
