A special meeting of the City Council is hereby called to meet in the Council Chamber at City Hall at 6 o'clock P. M. this day for the purpose of considering and passing an ordinance granting the Houston and Texas Central Railroad Company the right to construct, maintain and use a steel fuel oil storage tank; and to construct, maintain and operate the necessary pump, pipe connections, and other appliances for pumping oil from tank cars to said storage tank, and from said tank to its round house, machine shops, and locomotives; to use said fuel oil at its round house and shops; and to construct and operate a spur track adjacent to said oil tank in the City of Austin, Texas.
