Memorandum To:

Mayor Mullen called to order the meeting of the Council scheduled for 1:00 p.m., noting the presence of all Councilmembers.

MINUTES APPROVED

The Council, on Councilmember Shipman's motion, Mayor Pro Tem Trevino's second, approved the minutes for regular meetings of December 1, 8, 15, 1983 and Special meeting of December 14, 1983. (7-0 Vote)

Motion

Councilmember Shipman made a motion, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Trevino to delay 120 days.

Bill Gunn appeared before Council to say he had submitted a plat in October, 1982 on this property and reviewed what has happened. He wants to be annexed. Mr. Nias, Assistant City Attorney, pointed out that initiation of annexation must begin 90 days after the first reading of an annexation ordinance. If there is a 120 day delay the process will have to start all over again.

LATER IN THE DAY Council continued the discussion. Mr. Gunn said there is water and wastewater and sewer and he wants the property zoned so they can know how they can use the property. It will be zoned if it is annexed.

LOOP 360 PROTECTION ORDINANCE

The Council, on Councilmember Shipman's motion, Councilmember Rose's second, waived the requirement for three readings and finally passed the Loop 360 Protection Ordinance as amended. (7-0 Vote)

Prior to the vote, Crockett Keller, who owns the property at the northwest corner of Loop 360 and Bee Caves Road, asked the Council to amend the ordinance to include the retail development that has been on that corner for years.

Mr. Lillie referred to amendments made at the December 20th public hearing concerning the ordinance. He said he would like to come back to Council later and clarify several of the amendments.
