Mr H P Lockwood to refund from fees.  
By the Mayor. Petition of G. A. Lockwood, asking that certain

sums paid by him be refunded. Read and on motion referred to the Committee on claims and accounts.

By Alderman Martinen Petition and bill of Dr. H. N. Anger

for services to horses. Read and on motion referred to

the Committee on claims and accounts.

By Alderman Redd. Petition of citizens of South Austin  
against extending against the extension of the pound limits, to include the  
pound limits 1st Ward. Read and on motion referred to the Police  
Committee and Alderman Redd.

Reports of Standing Committees.

Alderman Nitschke for the Street Committee to whom was  
referred the petition of P. L. Ribbeck, asking that certain  
street work be done. Presented a report recommending  
that the City Engineer be directed to open the gutters on 6<sup>th</sup>  
Street between Rio Grande St and Shoal Creek, and on  
West Avenue between 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Streets. The report of the  
Committee was adopted.

Alderman Low for the Committee on claims and accounts  
to whom was referred the petition of D. S. Corn for correction  
of assessment, presented a report recommending that  
the petition be granted, and that the Assessor & Collector be  
authorized and directed to correct said assessment in  
accordance with the request. The report of the Committee  
was adopted.

Alderman Nitschke for the Street Committee to whom was  
referred an ordinance appropriating the sum of \$300.  
to construct a culvert across Little Shoal Creek between  
Nucess and San Antonio Streets, on 16<sup>th</sup> St, presented a  
report recommending that the ordinance be amended  
as to make said appropriation for \$200. instead of \$300. and  
that the ordinance so amended do pass.

Alderman Schneider moved that the ordinance be  
referred to the Creek Committee which Motion prevailed  
it.

Alderman Hume for the Committee on claims to whom  
was referred the report of the City Engineer for the month of  
April 1902 presented a report stating that they had examined  
same and found it correct. The report was adopted.

Hospital on Alderman Davis for the Hospital Committee to whom was referred the reports of the City Physician and the Matron of the City Physician Health Hospital for the month of April 1902. presented a report stating that they had been examined and found correct. On motion the report was adopted.

Alderman Dow for the special Committee to whom was referred previous reports of special Committee appointed to investigate the managements of the City & Co Hospital, presented the following report.

To Honorable, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Austin.

Gentlemen:

Specie on  
Hospital

The your undersigned Special Committee to whom was referred the previous reports of the special Committee appointed to investigate the management of the City and County Hospital, and to whom was delegated the duty of investigating the facts relating to the proper future course to be pursued by the City with reference to the management of that institution, beg leave to report and to submit to the Council a proposition which has been made by the County Commissioners Court for the continued operation of the said Hospital.

The proposition is as follows, viz:

"The City and County Hospital to be run for the period of twelve months from date of acceptance of this proposition on following terms:

1. The actual management of the institution to be under the control of the City.
2. The County to appropriate monthly the sum of \$200.00 to pay its estimated pro rata share of the running expenses of the Hospital.
3. No expense to be incurred for permanent improvements without mutual agreement on part of the City and County; and, in the event of such agreement being made, the City and County to bear equally the expense of improvements erected under such agreements.

4. At the end of the contract year if it shall be shown that the running expenses of the Hospital have exceeded the sum of \$4800.00, the County obligates itself to pay one half of such excess; and if the expenses for such year be shown to be less than \$4800.00 the City shall at the end of the year pay to the County one-half of the difference between the amount of such expenses and the sum of \$4800.00.

5. The term "running expenses" as used above includes all of the expenses to be incurred in the regular and legitimate operation of the Hospital.

We beg to recommend the acceptance by the City of the proposition set out above, for the reason that we deem it to furnish a

fair and equitable basis for running the Hospital

release agreement. Whereas by resolution adopted by the City Council  
then passed on the above mentioned date, it was provided  
to Mrs. Robinson that if said Mrs. L.L. Robinson would convey the  
City for street purposes a certain strip of land  
in said resolution described, that the claim for  
taxes should be released and; -

Whereas the said Mrs. L.L. Robinson has accepted  
said proposition and conveyed said land  
to the City. Therefore. The Mayor is hereby  
authorized and instructed to release, receipt  
for said judgments for taxes.

Alderman Maddox the following resolution  
Resolution that Be it resolved by the City Council of the City  
the entire bonded debt of Austin. That it is the sense of the Council  
that entire outstanding bonded debt of the  
City should be refunded on the terms embraced  
in the refunding bond ordinance heretofore  
enacted by the Council and the Mayor  
and Finance Committee are hereby authorized  
and instructed to refund on said bases  
all bonds which may be offered from time  
to time for that purpose, including such bonds  
if any, as are now in litigation in the Federal  
Court and all other bonds of the same or similar  
description.

The resolution was read and on motion was  
referred to a special committee consisting of  
Aldermen Shumate, Crooker, and Redd  
Alderman Mullins moved that the committee

Now proceed to elect a dog catcher, and assistant
