The Mayor called the attention of the Council to the case of
 Miss Bailey who had been an inmate of the Hospital
 for some time past and who has been paying to the City the
 sum of \$10.⁰⁰ per month for board & lodging, and that under the
 rules adopted recently by the Council fixing the rate for pay
 patients at \$2.⁰⁰ per day, which amount she claims she is not
 able to pay, he asked that the Council take some action on the
 matter. On motion the matter was referred to the Hospital
 Committee and the City Physician and Matron of the Hospital
 were authorized to allow her to remain, at her former rate
 until the Committee should report
