An Ordinance

Providing for the vacation of that portion of Sabine street
embraced between 18th + 19th streets, and prescribing the terms
of such provision

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Austin:

That that portion of Sabine street embraced between Blocks
64 and 71. And between 18th + 19th streets, City of Austin be and is
hereby vacated, and the Board of Trustees of the State Blind
Asylum are hereby granted as against the City of Austin,
the right to enclose, use and erect buildings on said portion
of said street: provided however this ordinance shall not
become effective for any purpose until said board of Trustees
shall have refrained and put in good condition for travel
that portion of Red River street embraced between 18th + 19th
streets to the satisfaction of the City Engineer and Street
Commissioner which satisfaction shall be evidenced by a statement
in writing to that effect to be filed with the City Clerk.

Austin Texas Nov 3rd 1902

To the Hon R. E. White, Mayor, and the City Council of the
City of Austin

Gentlemen:

I hand you herewith my monthly report showing the condition of my accounts with the City of Austin up to date.

In submitting this report, I beg to advise you that it is the last which I shall probably submit and Iannah pass over this opportunity to thank you for the many acts of courtesy extended to me during my incumbency as City Treasurer. A business engagement will necessitate my removal from Austin and I hereby and herewith tender my resignation as Treasurer of the City of Austin effective tonight. Hoping for you in your individual capacity and for you as representatives of the City which for some years has been my home, and wishing for that city the peace and prosperity which you have labored so hard to secure for it, I beg you to believe me

Alderman Maddox moved that the resignation of City Treasurer Billiard be accepted, and that a Committee of three Aldermen, together with the Mayor and City Attorney be appointed to check up his accounts and to turn over the office to his successor, which motion prevailed. The Mayor appointed Aldermen Maddox Shelley and Hume as such Committee.

Alderman Shelley offered the following resolution which was read and adopted unanimously adopted by a rising vote.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin; That in accepting the resignation of the Hon H. P. Billiard, as City Treasurer of the City of Austin, this body deems it proper to express its appreciation of the high standard of business ability and personal integrity which Mr Billiard has brought to the discharge of the duties of his official position; And we hereby formally express the deep regret which we feel at the loss which the City sustains from his resignation.

Alderman Maddox moved that the Council now proceed to the election of a City Treasurer to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Treasurer Hilliard, which motion prevailed.

The Mayor declared nominations for City Treasurer to fill out the term of Treasurer Hilliard, now in order.

Alderman Shelley nominated William H. Fults.

Alderman Davis moved that nominations close, and that the Clerk be directed to cast the entire vote of the Council for William H. Fults, which motion prevailed.

The Clerk cast 13 votes for William H. Fults for City Treasurer and the Mayor declared him duly elected as City Treasurer of the City of Austin, to fill out the term of H. Hilliard resigned.
