By Alderman Maddox Petition of Sharp & Beals for  
permission to erect a wooden iron roofed shed  
within the fire limits Read and on motion referred  
to the Fire Commissioners

By Alderman Ulit, Petition of Abatrons asking  
to have certain found fees refunded

Read and on motion referred to the Committee on  
Claims and Accounts

By the Mayor Communication from the City Engineer  
calling the attention of the Council to the condition of  
the streets and asking an appropriation for repairs

Read and on motion referred to the Street Committee

By the Mayor Petition of R.W. Buldington for street  
work. Read and referred to the Street Committee  
By Alderman Schneider Petition of W.F. Sill Chief  
of the fire Dept asking appropriation for the purpose  
of repairing Fire Reel Read and on motion referred  
to the Fire Committee

Alderman Schneider moved that the Council take  
a recess for 5 minutes last

Reports of City Officers

The Mayor laid before the Council the reports of City  
officers (except that of the Treasurer) for the month of  
July 1903, which were on motion referred to  
their appropriate Committee's without reading

Reports of Standing Committees

Alderman Maddox for the Finance Committee to  
whom was referred the reports of the Assessors & Collector  
the Treasurer and the Clerk for the month of May  
1903, presented a report stating that they had  
been examined and found correct. The report was adopted  
Alderman Haynes for the Committee on Claims and  
Accounts to whom was referred the petition of Minnie  
Marshall for damages presented a report recommending  
that she be paid the sum of \$100.00 in settlement  
of her claim, she agreeing to take such and such  
settlement. The report was adopted.

Alderman Redd for the Hospital Committee motion  
was referred the report of the City Physician for the month  
of June 1903, presented a report stating that they had  
examined same and found it correct.  
The report of the Committee was adopted.

Ord. increasing salary of Pound Master & Watchman  
Laid on the table

The Mayor laid before the Council an ordinance increasing  
the salary of Pound Master and Day Clerk at the Police  
Station. The ordinance was read the third time and  
on motion of Alderman Haynes was laid on the table.  
The Mayor laid before the Council an ordinance  
regulating the presence of children under the age of  
17 years upon the streets and alleys of the City at night.  
The ordinance was read the third time and passed  
by the following vote.

#### New business

Alderman Shumate presented a bill of L. C. Ellington  
for work done at Peace Park, which was  
read and referred to the Park Committee.

The Mayor laid before the Council a communication  
from L. Gree President of the Austinland Suburban  
Railroad Company accepting the provision of an  
ordinance authorizing said Company to use steam  
or electricity on said road. On motion the communication  
was ordered filed.

Validating remaining  
ord. June 1901.

By Alderman Maddox an ordinance, validating  
and re-enacting "an ordinance levying taxes  
for the year 1901.

The ordinance was passed under suspension

\$300. to repair W<sup>12<sup>th</sup></sup> st

By Alderman Shelley an ordinance appropriating  
the sum of \$300. for the purpose of repairing  
W<sup>12<sup>th</sup></sup> street from Rio Grande to Blanco streets.  
The ordinance was read the first time and  
on motion was referred to the Street Committee.  
By Alderman Haynes an ordinance appropriat-  
ing the sum of \$100<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of paying  
damages claimed by Mamie Marvel.  
The ordinance was read the first time and  
on motion the rule was suspended and it

placed on its second reading by the following vote  
 Yeas Aldermen Crooker Haynes <sup>11</sup> Hume Macken Maddar  
 Miller Nitzeke Redd Schneider Shelley Shumate  
 Smith Whit  
 Nays None. <sup>x3</sup>

The ordinance was read the second time  
 Alderman Maddar moved to amend same by adding  
 "And the City Attorney is directed to prepare proper  
 receipt" The amendment was adopted, and the  
 ordinance passed by the following vote  
 Yeas Aldermen Crooker Haynes Macken Maddar  
 Miller Nitzeke Redd Schneider Shelley Shumate  
 Smith Whit <sup>x3</sup>  
 Nays None.

Alderman Schneider offered the following  
 Resolution requiring  
 Marshal Koppa's  
 list of dogs impounded that the Marshal shall keep in his office a record  
 of all dogs impounded giving a description  
 of same. The resolution was lost by the following vote  
 Yeas Alderman Maddar Schneider <sup>2</sup>  
 Nays Aldermen Crooker Haynes Hume Macken  
 Miller Nitzeke Redd Shelley Shumate Whit <sup>11</sup>

On motion of Alderman Shelley Assessor  
 & Collector Ziller was granted a leave of absence  
 for 2 weeks commencing the day he leaves the City  
 On motion the Police Committee was permitted  
 to make a report

Alderman Shelley from the Police Committee  
 to whom was referred an ordinance amending  
 Art 127 of the Revised Penal Code, presented a report  
 recommending the passage of the ordinance  
 Alderman Whit offered a substitute for the  
 ordinance. On motion of Alderman Maddar  
 further consideration was postponed until the  
 next meeting and the ordinance and substitute  
 ordered printed in the minutes -  
 The following is the ordinance and substitute

An ordinance  
 To Amend Article 127 of the Revised Penal ordinances  
 of the City of Austin

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Austin:  
 Section 1. That Article 127 of the Revised Penal ordinances  
 of the City of Austin shall hereafter read as follows.  
 Art 127. That if the owner, keeper or person in charge  
 of any horse, mule, jack, jennet, cattle, sheep,  
 misk cow hog, sheep or goat shall suffer or permit  
 the said .. to run at large at any time, within

the corporate limits of this City, except that Milk Cows may be permitted to run at large in the daytime, south of the Colorado River, east of Comal Street, and north of Nineteenth Street, east of Waller Creek and Durval Street and west of Blanca Street, he or she shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined in any sum not less than five nor more than One hundred dollars for each animal so running at large.

Section 2. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by the City Charter.

#### An ordinance

To amend article 127 of the Revised Penal ordinances of the City of Austin:

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Austin:

Section 1. That Article 127 of the Revised Penal ordinances of the City of Austin, be & so amended as to hereafter read as follows:

Art 127. That if the owner, keeper or person in charge of any horse, mule, Jack, jennet, cattle, Calf, Milk Cow, hog, sheep or goat shall suffer or permit the same to run at large at any time within the corporate limits of the City of Austin, except that Milk Cows may be permitted to run at large, in the daytime, south of the Colorado River, east of Chicon Street north of Sixth Street, North of Nineteenth Street east of Waller Creek and Durval Street, East of each Avenue south of Sixth Street, West of Shoal Creek North of Sixth Street and west of Blanca Street South of Sixth Street, he or she shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined in any sum not less than five nor more than One hundred dollars for each animal so running at large.

Section 2. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by the City Charter.
