Alderman Haynes moved that the Mayor be instructed to enter into contract with St John & Ref for paving Congress Avenue & the Colorado River bridge and that they be required to use cement filler, which motion prevailed.

Alderman Haynes moved that the Paving Committee and City Engineer be directed to notify parties who have buildings in the street near the foot of Congress Avenue to move their buildings back to the street line, which motion prevailed.

The report of the Committee was then adopted and the bid of Ben St John and Ref accepted.

Be it resolved by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Austin:
That the City of Austin, through the Board, hereby extends a most hearty and cordial welcome and invitation to the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, which meets in the City of San Antonio, on March 4th 1907, to hold its regular annual session in the City of Austin, in March 1908, assuring that body of the cordial welcome of the citizens of Austin and that they will there see many evidences of the greatness of Texas, which visitors are assured will even constitute a most pleasing recollection in the memories of the members of the Grand Lodge. And let it further

Received, that the City Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to forward a copy of this resolution immediately to the Grand Master & O.O.F. at San Antonio.

The Mayor laid before the Council an ordinance authorizing and confirming the sale by the City of Austin, and its Board of School Trustees, of lots No four and each twenty-five feet of lot No three and one lot No six, seven and eighty all in Block No One hundred and thirty-two, in the City of Austin, Travis County and State of Texas.

The ordinance was read the first time. Alderman Powell moved that the ordinance be referred back to the School Board for explanation, which motion prevailed.
