Powell should resign the position which he has so long held and filled to the entire satisfaction of his immediate Constituents and of the entire City, and that in his retirement with his friends and associates, deeply appreciating his many admirable and favorable qualities as well as his sturdy nature and honesty of purpose in his labors for the prosperity and welfare of this beautiful City, do hereby tender him our most hearty, sincere and unanimous good wishes for his continuous prosperity, long life and happiness.

Resolved second That a copy of this preamble and resolution, suitably certified by the City Clerk and signed by the Mayor, be forwarded to the said P. H. Powell, as an additional mark of our esteem and friendship.

Committee to take Alderman Lumsden that a Committee of 3 Aldermen into consideration to go with the City Attorney be appointed to take up the matter of calling the Warden of ordering an election to fill the Vacancy an election for Alderman attempted to report their conclusions at the next regular Meeting of the Council, which motion prevailed.

The Mayor appointed as such Committee Aldermen Lumsden Haynes and Crooker, together with the City Attorney. By Alderman Haynes An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$5000.00 for the purpose of building a New City Hall. The ordinance was read the first time and passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote
