Austin, Texas, July 11th 1907

To the Hon City Council of Austin Texas
Gentlemen:

I beg to submit to your Honorable
Docy. this my disapproval of the item of \$88⁰⁰ for
the pay of Extra Police for the Month of June 1907
My reasons for Vetoing said item are:
First: No debt should be created for any purpose by
any officer of the City without first being authorized
by the "City" Council

Second: In this case the City Marshal did not attempt to create such an obligation.

Third: The condition of the City finances is such that we must use the strictest economy in our expenditures.

Austin, Texas, July 1st 1907

To the Hon. City Council of Austin, Texas,
Gentlemen:

I beg to return to you, without my approval
your resolution granting Fred Malone a leave of absence of
fifteen days with full pay.

I respectfully call your attention to section 120, 121 & 122
of our City Charter.

The estimates required for the fiscal year ending Decem^{ber}
1907, have been made. Also the salaries and officers
and regular employees have been fixed by the City Council.
The estimate of \$720.00 for paying bridge keeper being fixed.
There is nothing in the budget to pay for a substitute
for the bridge keeper during the fifteen days absence.
The condition of the General Revenue account is such
that no money ~~can be~~^{will be} budgeted can be drawn therefrom
in fact unless very large collections of back fares are
made we will end this fiscal year with a deficiency of
\$5000.00 on \$6000.00

Under the State Law it is made the duty of the City to
police the bridge. The City is under the same law liable
for damage for accidents - hence we must have the
services of the keeper. Having no money to pay for a
substitute, I must return the resolution disapproved.


