Petitions, memorials etc

By the Mayor Petition of Miss Jennie Saetham, asking to have certain street work done, read and on motion referred to the Street Committee.

By the Mayor - Petition of D. C. Browne, asking to have certain pound fees refunded - Read and on motion referred to the Committee on Claims & accounts.

By Alderman Miller - Petition of citizens of South Austin, asking to have road opened - On motion the petition was granted and the City Marshal & City Attorney directed to open said road, and the Engineer directed to stake out that part of the road to be opened, through the land of Joe Brackenridge.

Alderman Redd entered the Council Chamber.

By Alderman Miller, petition of citizens of South Austin to have bridge removed and repaired - Read and on motion referred to the Street Committee.

By Alderman Nitschke, petition of Hermann Keise to have certain pound fees refunded - Read and on motion referred to the Committee on Claims & accounts.

By the Mayor. Petition of H. B. Walker Sons, asking permission to erect a platform - Read and on motion referred to the Street Committee.

Reports of City Officers

The Mayor laid before the Council the report of the City Treasurer for the month of April 1904, which was on motion referred to the Finance Committee, without reading.

Reports of Standing Committees

Alderman Schneider for the Finance Committee presented the following report which was read and adopted.

Hon R. E. White - Mayor, & Board of Aldermen of the City of

Austin, Tex.

Gentlemen:

The Com. on Finance beg leave to report the purchase of bonds for the sinking fund as follows:

First, June 2nd, 1903, we bought twenty bonds No.

1874 to 1890, both numbers inclusive, each for five hundred dollars, from H. N. Swain, for seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7500.00)

Second, Nov 20th 1903, we bought Refunding bonds Nos 1096 thru (one thousand dollars) from John W. Drummond & Co of St Louis Mo for which we paid seven hundred and thirty dollars flat in St Louis

Third, December 21st 1903, we bought Refunding bonds Nos 235, 237, 238, 239 + 240, each for one thousand dollars, from C & Shepard & Co of New York N.Y. and paid three thousand six hundred and fifty three + 79/100 dollars (three thousand dollars by telegrams).

Fourth, April 8th 1904, we bought of Paul Koerner of Clarksville Mo. Refunding bonds Nos 181 + 182, (each for five hundred dollars) and paid seven hundred and forty two 09/100 dollars. (\$762.09)

Making a total of seventeen thousand dollars of face value of bonds for which we paid twelve thousand six hundred and forty five + 79/100 dollars (\$12645.79) on Seven hundred and forty three 87/100 dollars per thousand.

We have now in the sinking fund account twenty seven thousand face value in bonds - and in the account of bonds issued prior to May 1st 1890, twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) face value of bonds.

Gentlemen:

The Your Finance Committee, by leave to hand you for such action as you may deem proper, the following described coupons of the Refunding bonds of the City of Austin dated July 1st 1901, all of which have been paid by H. A. Kroe, City Treasurer, and by him turned over to your Committee Viz:

1st Coupons Nos 2+3, due July 1st 1902 and January 1st 1903, each for fifteen dollars on bonds Nos 1132 + 1133, from coupons making a total of sixty dollars

2nd Coupons No 4 due July 1st 1903, as follows Viz:

On bonds Nos 83 to 86 from coupons each for seven 70/100 dollars, making a total of thirty dollars, on bonds Nos 638, 675, 808, 819, 821, 825, 871, 1091, 1092, 1132, 1133, 1378, 1079

1380, 1421 - Fifteen Coupons for fifteen dollars each making a total of two hundred and twenty-five dollars, On bonds Nos 1457 to 1490 forty coupons for fifteen dollars each making a total of six hundred dollars
 3rd Coupons No 5. due January 1st 1904, as follows, viz :
 In bonds Nos 1 to 72 Seventy two Coupons for seven & one-half dollars each making a total of five hundred and forty dollars
 On bonds Nos 74 to 90 seventeen Coupons each for seven and 50/100 dollars, making a total of one hundred and twenty seven & 50/100 dollars - On bonds Nos 93 to 164, Seventy two Coupons, each for seven & 50/100 dollars making a total of five hundred and forty dollars - On bonds Nos 1789 to 1893, one-hundred and five Coupons for seven & one-half dollars each making a total of seven hundred & eighty seven & 50/100 dollars - On bonds Nos 457 to 870 inclusive four hundred & twenty Coupons for fifteen dollars each making a total of six thousand & three hundred dollars, on bonds Nos 872 to 1060 inclusive one hundred & eighty nine Coupons for fifteen dollars each making a total of two thousand eight hundred and thirty five dollars - On bonds Nos 1062 to 1107 inclusive forty six Coupons for fifteen dollars each making a total of six hundred & ninety dollars - on bonds Nos 1109 to 1557 inclusive, four hundred & forty nine Coupons for fifteen dollars each making a total of six thousand seven hundred & thirty five dollars - on bonds Nos 1559 to 1581 inclusive twenty three Coupons for fifteen dollars each making a total of three hundred and forty five dollars.
 Making a grand total of interest paid by Coupons reported of nineteen thousand eight hundred and fifteen dollars.

Alderman Schneider for the Finance Committee presented the following report, which was read and adopted

Gentlemen:

We your Committee on Finance, beg leave to hand you for such disposition as you may deem proper, the following described bonds for which we have exchanged Refunding bonds of date July 1st 1901, V.iz :

On January 27th & 28th and April 5th, 1904, we exchanged Refunding bonds Nos 1582 to 1588 both numbers inclusive, each for one thousand dollars, for Water Works & Electric light bonds

Nos 40 to 44 each number inclusive, and Numbers 365 and 1368 each for One thousand dollars, The said interest at the rate of 5% Called for in the old bonds from April 1st 1901 to July 1st 1901, or Sixty two & 50/100 dollars on each bond, or a total of Four hundred & thirty seven & 50/100 dollars, and at the rate of 3%. Called for in the Refunding bonds, from July 1st 1901, to January 1st 1904, or Seventy five dollars on each bond, or a total of five hundred & twenty five dollars.

On February 1st and April 28th 1904, we exchanged Refunding bonds Nos 165 to 182 both inclusive each for five hundred dollars for funding bonds Nos 1+3, 16 to 29 & 50 & 51 each for five hundred dollars, The said interest at the rate of 6% Called for in Said Funding bonds, from April 1st 1901, to July 1st 1901, or Seven & 50/100 dollars on each bond, making a total of one hundred & thirty five dollars, And at the rate of 3% Called for in the Refunding bonds, from July 1st 1901, to January 1st 1904, or Thirty seven & 50/100 dollars on each bond, making a total of six hundred & seventy five dollars— Making a grand total of interest paid of one thousand seven hundred & seventy two & 50/100 dollars, One hundred & thirty five dollars of which was paid out of account interest on bonds prior to May 1st 1890, the balance of one thousand six hundred & thirty seven & 50/100 dollars was paid out of Bonded Indebtedness account.

The hand you have with said bonds 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 365 & 1368 together with Coupons Nos 40. to 160, both inclusive, also bonds Nos 1, 3, 16, 17, 18, 14, 30, 21, 22, 23, 26, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 50 & 51, with Coupons Nos 13 to 60 inclusive, also Coupons 710¹ to 8¹ inclusive on Refunding bonds Nos 165 to 182 both inclusive and 1582, to 1586 both inclusive, which we paid and detached when the bonds were exchanged.

Alderman Crookshank for a minority of the Committee presented a report recommending that the ordinance do not pass. On motion the reports were laid over to come up with the ordinance under the head of Unfinished business.

Alderman Hume for the ordinance Committee to whom was referred an ordinance appropriating the sum of \$300. for the purpose of opening street etc to Peace Park presented a report recommending that the ordinance do pass and that the money be taken out of the Street Improvement fund. On motion the report was adopted.

Alderman Hume for the ordinance Committee to whom was referred providing for the future construction of plumbing and house drainage etc, presented a report and offering a substitute for said ordinance. On motion the report and substitute were laid over to come up with the ordinance under the head of Unfinished business.

Alderman Redd for the Hospital Committee to whom was referred the report of the City Physician for the month of April 1904, presented a report stating that same had been examined and found correct. On motion the report was adopted.
