On motion of Alderman Shelley, Art Assessor & Collector Henry Zillen was granted a leave of absence for two weeks, commencing Wednesday Aug 17th 1904.

Reports of City Officers

The Mayor laid before the Council the reports of the City Treasurer, the City Marshal, the Matron of the Hospital & the Dog Catcher, for the month of July 1904, which were on motion referred to their appropriate Committee without reading.

Reports of Standing Committees

Alderman Miller for the Water Light Committee to whom was referred a petition of citizens for a water trough on each side of West Avenue at the intersection of 23rd Street, presented a report recommending that the petition be granted and the trough be established. On motion the report was adopted.

Alderman Haynes for the Finance Committee to whom was referred the reports of the Assessor & Collector, the Treasurer and the Clerk, for the month of June 1904 presented a report stating that same had been examined and found correct. On motion the report was adopted.

Alderman Haynes for the Claims & accounts Committee, to whom was referred the complaint of J. Schipper et al against the Pound Master, also the petition of Schipper asking that pound fees refunded, presented a report stating that the Pound Master had not acted without authority as the stock was

Alderman Redd for the Hospital Committee to whom was referred the reports of the City Physician for the months of June & July 1904, presented reports stating that same had been examined and found correct. On motion the reports were adopted.

Unfinished business

The Mayor laid before the Council an ordinance directing the City Marshall to open a certain road in South Austin. The ordinance was read the third time.

Alderman Crookshank offered the following resolution Resolved that the Mayor of the City be authorized to appoint three Engineers to locate the road now being discussed before the City Council, that the Council may vote intelligently on this subject, and that the matter be postponed until the next regular meeting, at which time they are requested to report.

Alderman Shumate moved to amend the resolution by making the number of Engineers to be appointed two and that the petition to open the road appoint & pay one and Mr. Butter appoint & pay one, and that the City Engineer act upon the path of the City. The amendment was accepted by Alderman Crookshank. Alderman Schneider moved to further amend the resolution by adding the "Street Committee". Alderman Crookshank accepted the amendment. The resolution as amended was then passed.
