Therefore be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin that the City Engineer be and is hereby instructed to place all of said iron bridges on said street crossings, where marsh needed, and as several of said bridges were broken when removed from the Avenue crossings and must be repaired before they can be used, the City Engineer is instructed to ascertain and report to this Council the cost of placing such broken bridges in repair.
