Memorandum To:

Mayor Pro Tem Trevino called to order the Special Called Meeting of the Council, noting the absence of Mayor Mullen and Councilmember Spaeth. Mayor Pro Tem Trevino announced the purpose of the meeting is a public hearing on annexation of the following:

- c. C7a-83-017 - Area 21 (Full Purpose)
- d. C7a-84-007 - FM 2244 from Commons Ford to Hwy. 71 (Limited Purpose)
- e. C7a-84-008 - Hwy. 71 to Convict Hill Rd. (Limited Purpose)
- f. C7a-84-009 - RM 620 from Commanche Trail to Hwy. 71 (Limited Purpose)
- g. C7a-84-010 - RM 620 from the C.L.L. to Round Rock's ETJ (Limited Purpose)
- h. C7a-84-011 - Scenic Brook West, Windmill Run Subdivisions and Motorola Tract (Full Purpose)
- i. C7a-84-014 - Westwoods Shopping Center (Conversion - Limited to Full Purpose)
- j. C7a-84-015 - Windridge Subdivision (Full Purpose)
- k. C7a-84-016 - Cat Mt. Area (4 tracts) (Full Purpose)

Brian Schuller showed maps of the proposed annexation areas. He said they total 38.5 square miles with a population of 29,669. Mr. Schuller pointed out that annexation of the Motorola Tract for full purpose may be premature because the area is not ready for it yet.

Council discussed proposed annexation case by case.

Pete Dwyer asked what zoning the property will have when it is first annexed. Mr. Schuller told him it would be zoned Interim "A" and the property owner would have to go through the zoning process with an approved site plan for a zoning change.

Russell Robertson asked what is meant by full annexation. He said we have water and electricity now. Mr. Schuller said it will include soft service, fire, police, garbage, water and wastewater and a capacity plant for the area has been approved under CIP.

Russ Downey, president, Castlewood Neighborhood Association, said annexation would not mean any additional service for them.

John Phelps, Castlewood Forest, told Council, "we don't need your police & fire service, we won't get anything."

Fred Jones, Bitter Road Homeowners Association, asked if the City would maintain their septic tanks. Terry Childers, Assistant City Manager, told him no.

Marilyn James, Castlewood, asked if they will have a park. She was told \$1,400,000 will be requested in the 1987-88 CIP for that purpose.

Cornelia Redelius said Lamplight Village Neighborhood Association wants limited purpose annexation so their property can be zoned properly.

Dennis Kebenity, Walnut Acres Neighborhood Association, favors limited purpose annexation.

Mr. Hill appeared and said he is not altogether opposed to annexation.

Pat Krutsinger said the level of service of EMS and CPR would be lower with the City.

Harold Krutsinger spoke about the good fire service they have now.

Evelyn Young, Balcones Village, asked Council to consider this further.

John Murphy, fire control for Travis County, said they want to plan fire control with the City as they feel they already have it under control.

Charlie Anderson said they need a fire station in the area.

Chief Roberts explained the response time and said they have the depth to respond to emergencies.

Councilmember Rose said he is concerned with some of the questions and asked for a report the next day on preliminary contracting.

Gary Brown discussed drainage and asked if a study has been done.
